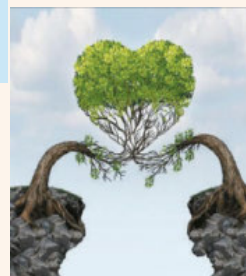

ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER

Stewardship Message: In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here, Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. In fact, this parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward. The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levi brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is watching for those who might be in need. He has a hospitable way of looking at the world around him and so he is able to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man. Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to serve this man, setting aside his own schedule and plans to meet his needs. He does not just give the man a few dollars or offer quick words of encouragement from across the road. He goes right up to the man. He cleans and bandages his wounds. He puts the man on his own animal and brings him to an inn where he can heal. He ensures the innkeeper would continue to look after him, and he commits to returning to the man on his way back. That is how we live out God's commandments. That is true hospitality and service. That is how a good steward springs into action when he comes upon a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us personally, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise." **The Catholic Steward**

End of Fiscal Year 2021-22: On June 30 we ended our fiscal year. The Financial Scoreboard shown below are the final totals for FY 2021-22. For the first time in over ten years, we fell substantially short of our Sunday envelope budgeted collection. We are hopeful that in the coming fiscal year we build up the financial support to the level of prior years. Your generosity allows us to continue "Engaging in God's Service".

We find that sending out six month statements reduces the inquiries when the year-end tax statements are sent in January. Overall, most of those who pledged have contributed towards their pledge, but compared to previous years, more donors have yet to contribute towards their pledge.

PASTORAL PEARLS

Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise “Pearls” or “Tools” to help us be that Love of God.

Today’s Pearl: *“Grief is not a disorder, a disease or a sign of weakness. It is an emotional, physical and spiritual necessity, the price you pay for love. The only cure for grief is to grieve” ~ Earl Grollman*

When I look at this visual I see so many of the things expressed to me time and again by people going through the grieving process – confusion, heartbreak, floods of tears, memories that soothe and that hurt, anger, doubt, depression.... I have felt it all to a degree through the deaths of my brother and my parents. But I was at a different place in my life for each of these deaths. I was a young adult when my brother took his own life, and grieving in my first years of college was something I didn’t know what to do with – so I just didn’t do anything with it. Not much, anyway. I did have a very understanding and supportive boyfriend at the time (who is now and still and forever my husband) who listened to me, gave me a shoulder to cry on, encouraged me to feel. But I think it was too much at that time, so I just allowed myself to be swept up in this new life of college and the whirlwind of so many things that claimed my full attention. Later, this unprocessed grief reared its ugly head again, and I had to face it more directly, and really look at how it had been affecting my life in so many subtle ways, whether I knew it or not. Processing it later in life may have been what I needed to do, but I never did successfully bury it. When each of my parents died I was able to be with them through their decline, so it was a more gradual grieving, where by the end of their lives, my grieving was mostly done too. Either way it became crystal clear to me the value of actually doing the work to process the grief and all of its’ feelings. This is probably why, in my work here at Guardian Angels, too, I encourage those who are grieving the loss of a loved one to find someone they can count on with whom they are allowed to express as much of their grief as they ever need to, for as long as needed, and still feel safe and valued. At Guardian Angels we offer 2 ways to help a person in this process: a BeFriender or the Healing Hearts Grief Support Group. A BeFriender can walk with you for as long or as little time as you want, just giving you the safe space to express your grief, ask your questions, make your plans, feel your roller-coaster of feelings... our Healing Hearts Grief Support Group can wrap you in a blanket of understanding and common experience and valuable insights from one another. You do not have to do this hard work all by yourself.



Loving God, thank you for being with us in our grief. Spirit, inspire those who most need it to reach out to find a gentle hand (or hands) to walk this un-asked-for journey with them. Bless those going through this grieving process for a loved one who has died, that they may know your love and comfort, know the care and comfort and understanding that a listening ears (ears) can provide, and find their way – in their own time- through the deep hurt of grief to a place of reconciliation with the grief in their everyday lives, cherishing the memories of the one who id no longer here with them. ~ Amen.

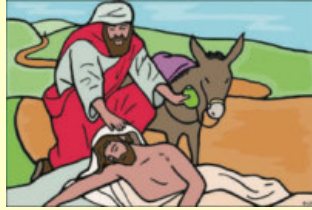
