### From Fr. Pat

Dear Friends in Christ,

Like many of you, I am sad to see Fr. Scott begin his new pastoral duties next year. I am also very happy for our archdiocese. Although another priest will succeed him in ministry to our group of parishes, no one can replace him. Fr. Schilmoeller is an incredibly gifted priest and will do wonderful work in vocation ministry.

What, however, is vocation ministry? Certainly as vocation director, Fr. Scott will be charged with working with men in formation for the priesthood and making connection with those who might be discerning. However, it is not his sole responsibility to provide candidates to serve our parish.

Our families, as the first school of faith and the domestic church, need to be the first place where children learn from their parents about vocations. From the Latin *vocare* meaning "to be called," vocations are ways in which God call's each one of us to live out our baptismal dignity. For some, this is the priesthood, for others religious life, for others the diaconate, and for still others the sacrament of matrimony. With respect to the priesthood and the religious life, it is not good enough to look at someone else's child for these vocations. Each family must look to their own children, encourage their children to seek the will of God in their life through listening in prayer, and to respond with generosity.

Further, our families need to be schools of faith and the domestic church in fact and not just in name. "Going to church" and "Being Church" are two distinctly different mindsets. Being Church involves actively pursuing the life as a disciple of Jesus Christ above our Sunday obligation to attend Mass. It certainly must be nourished by the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, but it must also be nourished by daily personal prayer, prayer as a family, and prayer-inspired reflection on what we believe as Catholics and why.

When more and more families within a parish move from "going to church" to "being Church," the life of faith will grow in our parishes. Parishes that serve the will of God come from families who seek to live the will of God. Without the work in the family, there will be very little that parishes or vocation directors will be able to do to foster vocations to the priesthood and the religious life.

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Como muchos de ustedes, me entristece ver que el Padre Scott comienza sus nuevas tareas pastorales el próximo ano. También me alegra mucho por nuestra arquidiócesis. Aunque será sustituido por otro sacerdote en el ministerio de nuestro grupo de parroquias, nadie puede remplazarlo. El Padre Schilmoeller es excepcional hará un extraordinario trabajo en el ministerio vocacional.

¿Pero que es ministerio vocacional? Ciertamente, como director vocacional, el P. Scott se encargará de trabajar con hombres en formación para el sacerdocio y hacer conexión con aquellos que puedan estar discerniendo. Sin embargo, no es su única responsabilidad proveer candidatos para servir a nuestra parroquia.

Nuestras familias, son como la primera escuela de fe y la iglesia doméstica, y necesitan ser el primer lugar donde de los niños aprenden de sus padres acerca de las vocaciones. Del latín vocare que significa "ser llamado", las vocaciones son las formas en las que Dios nos llama a cada uno de nosotros a vivir nuestra dignidad baptismal. Para algunos este es el sacerdocio para otros la vida religiosa, el diaconado, o el sacramento del matrimonio. Con respecto al sacerdocio y la vida religiosa, no es suficiente visualizar los hijos de otra persona para estas vocaciones. Cada familia tiene que ver a sus propios hijos y animarlos a buscar la voluntad de Dios en su vida escuchando la oración, y respondiendo con generosidad.

Además, nuestras familias necesitan ser escuelas de fe y la iglesia doméstica de hecho y no solo de nombre. "Ir a la iglesia" y "Ser Iglesia" son dos mentalidades claramente diferentes. Ser Iglesia implica perseguir activamente la vida como discípulo de Jesucristo por encima de nuestra obligación dominical de asistir a misa. Ciertamente debe ser alimentado por los sacramentos, especialmente la Eucaristía y la Reconciliación, pero también debe ser alimentado por la oración personal diaria, la oración en familia y la reflexión inspirada en la oración sobre lo que creemos como católicos y por qué.

Cuando mas y mas familias dentro de una parroquia pasan de "ir iglesia" a "ser iglesia", la vida de fe crece en nuestras parroquias. Las familias que sirven a la voluntad de Dios provienen de familias que buscan vivir la voluntad de Dios. Sin el trabajo en familia, habrá muy poco que las parroquias y directores de vocaciones pueden hacer para fomentar las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida religiosa.



#### **Lenten Regulations**

Everyone over 14 years of age is bound to observe the law of abstinence. Abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays within the season of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, everyone over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th years is also bound to observe the law of fast. On these two days, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, therefore, are the only days of both fast and abstinence.




