From Fr. Pat

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last weekend at Mass, we reflected on how important it is to Encounter Jesus. This encounter must be one where in our daily prayer we “pray without ceasing,” as St. Paul states. We must also, as a people of faith, see our need to come together in communal worship. This communal worship must not be limited to only our preferences, as if the Holy Mass was a commodity and we “customers”. Rather, our brothers and sisters in Christ must be recognized as such by our shared baptismal dignity, not our geographical or temporal placement. Certainly, each person has preferences, but our communal worship must be such that we can serve the needs of as many of the faithful as possible.

We must see our encounters with Jesus as important in the task we have in equipping ourselves for every good work. Developing a life of prayer beyond Mass and meal prayers, beyond morning and evening prayers, must be a priority. Reflecting in quiet on the Word of God in the Sacred Scriptures and time in praise and love before the Blessed Sacrament must become a priority in the life of the faithful. When in prayer, we must be like Samuel in the Old Testament, who says to the Lord, “Speak Lord, your servant is listening.” The Lord will open our hearts not only to our love but also in ways He desires us to share His love. We simply need to ask Him to direct our minds and our actions towards His greater glory.

As a Lenten opportunity, I invite every member of our parish to ask themselves a few questions. First, what must I do to encounter Jesus more fully in my life of prayer. This is different from asking what others can do. We all need to take responsibility for our own spiritual growth even though the pastors of our souls strive to form an environment in which such growth can flourish. Second, am I listening to Jesus speak to me in the silence in my heart, or am I simply speaking to Jesus without letting Him reply? Third, if I am listening to Jesus in my prayer reflections, can I also open my heart to listen to Him in terms of how I live my whole life?

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

El fin de semana pasado en la Misa, reflexionamos sobre lo importante que es encontrar a Jesús. Uno de estos encuentros debe ser en nuestra oración diaria "oremos sin cesar", como afirma San Pablo. También debemos, como pueblo de fe, ver nuestra necesidad de unimos en la adoración comunitaria. Este culto comunitario no debe limitarse solo a nuestras preferencias, como si la Santa Misa fuera una mercancía y nosotros "clientes". Más bien, nuestros hermanos y hermanas en Cristo deben ser reconocidos como tales por nuestra dignidad bautismal compartida, no por nuestra ubicación geográfica o temporal. Ciertamente, cada persona tiene preferencias, pero nuestra adoración comunitaria debe ser tal que podamos servir a las necesidades de tantos fieles como sea posible.

Debemos ver nuestros encuentros con Jesús como importantes como la misión que tenemos de prepararnos para toda buena obra. Desarrollar una vida de oración más allá de la misa y las oraciones de comida, más allá de las oraciones de la mañana y de la tarde, debe ser una prioridad. Reflexionar en silencio sobre la Palabra de Dios en las Sagradas Escrituras y el tiempo en la alabanza y el amor ante el Santísimo Sacramento debe convertirse en una prioridad en la vida de los fieles. Cuando estamos en oración, debemos ser como Samuel en el Antiguo Testamento, quien le dice al Señor: "Habla Señor, tu siervo está escuchando". El Señor abrirá nuestros corazones no sólo a nuestro amor, sino también de maneras en que Él desea que compartamos Su amor. Simplemente necesitamos pedirle que dirija nuestras mentes y nuestras acciones hacia Su mayor gloria.

Como una oportunidad de Cuaresma, invito a cada miembro de nuestra parroquia a hacerse algunas preguntas. Primero, ¿qué debo hacer para encontrar a Jesús más plenamente en mi vida de oración? Esto es diferente de preguntar qué pueden hacer los demás. Todos necesitamos asumir la responsabilidad de nuestro propio crecimiento espiritual a pesar de que los pastores de nuestras almas se esfuerzan por formar un ambiente en el que dicho crecimiento pueda florecer. Segundo, ¿estoy escuchando a Jesús hablarme en el silencio en mi corazón, o simplemente estoy hablando con Jesús sin dejar que Él responda? Tercero, si estoy escuchando a Jesús en mis oraciones de reflexión, ¿puedo también abrir mi corazón para escucharlo en términos de cómo vivo toda mi vida?

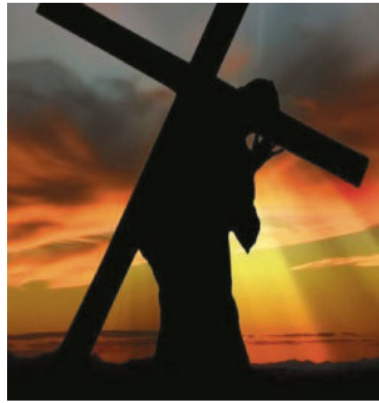

Lenten Regulations

Everyone over 14 years of age is bound to observe the law of abstinence. Abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays within the season of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, everyone over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th years is also bound to observe the law of fast. On these two days, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, therefore, are the only days of both fast and abstinence.

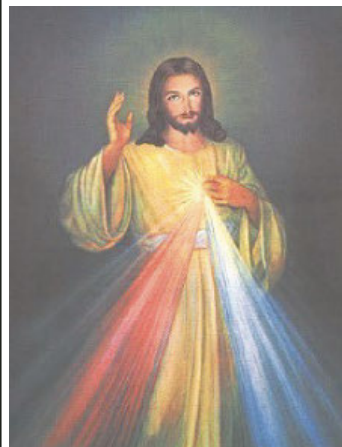

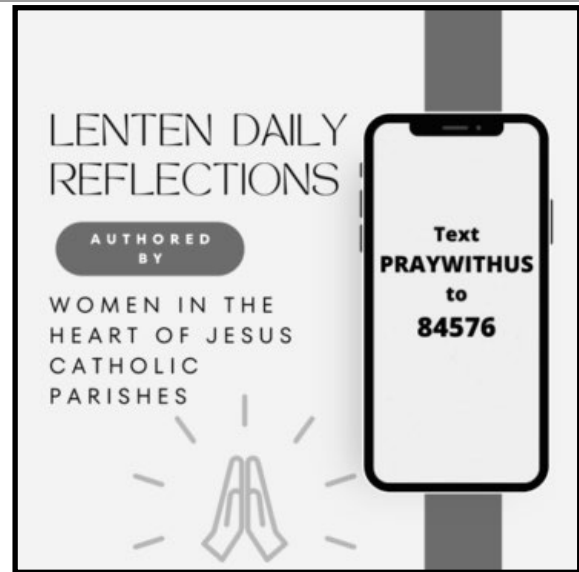
