Dear Friends in Christ,

Last weekend and this weekend, many of our young people are receiving the Holy Eucharist for the first time. The gift of Jesus in the Eucharist cannot be underemphasized. At the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are invited to participate fully in the saving action of Jesus. The celebration of the Eucharist makes present the reality of the Lord's Paschal Mystery in our presence.

The Mass is a real sacrifice in this sense. Jesus makes very clear the link between the Lord's Supper and His perfect sacrifice of Himself to the Father. The Body and Blood of Jesus are offered in perfect love and obedience to the Father for us. We are called to make our own spiritual sacrifices in union with Christ's perfect sacrifice as part of our worship. It is very important to remember that the Mass is a prayer directed in love and praise of the Father by the Son in the Holy Spirit. The priest in virtue of their ordination and the faithful in virtue of their baptism share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ. Although this sharing is of a different nature, everyone is called to embrace this sacrifice according to their station in life.

The Mass also brings about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. We must never let the frequency we receive communion be a cause for casual reception of this great gift, and it is important that we receive Holy Communion in light of the greatness the Eucharist is—the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Himself. By receiving Jesus fully in the Eucharist, we are incorporated more fully into His own divine life.

As our young people receive Holy Communion for the first time with great reverence and joy, let us use this opportunity to renew our own reverence and joy in receiving Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Este fin de semana pasado y este fin de semana, muchos de nuestros jóvenes recibieron la Santa Eucaristía por primera vez. Al regalo de Jesús en la Eucaristía no se le puede restar importancia. En el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, estamos invitados a participar plenamente en el acto de salvación de Jesús. La celebración de la Eucaristía hace presente entre nosotros la realidad del misterio pascual del Señor.

La misa es un sacrificio real en este sentido. Jesús deja muy claro el vínculo entre la cena del Señor y su sacrificio perfecto de sí mismo al Padre. Aunque este compartir es de una naturaleza diferente, cada uno está llamado a abrazar este sacrificio de acuerdo con su posición en la vida.

La misa también nos trae la presencia real de Jesús en la Eucaristía. No bebemos de permitir que la frecuencia con la que recibimos la comunión sea motivo de recepción casual de este gran don, y es muy importante que recibamos la Sagrada Comunión a la luz de la grandeza que es la Eucaristía—el Cuerpo, la Sangre, el Alma y la Divinidad de Jesús mismo. Al recibir a Jesús completamente en la Eucaristía, nos incorporamos más plenamente a su propia vida.


