

Great Day everyone!!,

Today is "Laetare Sunday" [the Sunday in which the entrance antiphon of the liturgy begins with the word "laetare"]. "Laetare" means "rejoice!" Midway through our Lenten journey towards Christ's Passion and Resurrection, the Church invites us to rejoice. Today's rose-colored vestments symbolize this rejoicing. In one sense, it is strange to rejoice right in the middle of this penitential season, when we are letting the Holy Spirit remind us of all our sins and selfish tendencies. However, if we go a little deeper, it makes perfect sense.

Christian joy isn't based on merely human motives. If it were, it would be unstable and temporary - because we human beings are flawed, and we fail; we betray and are betrayed.

Christian joy is not based on something so undependable as that. Rather it is based on God, who loves us thoroughly and powerfully right in the midst of our misery. He didn't make us earn his love; he gave it to us as a free gift: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." That gift made us into citizens of heaven, even though right now we are living here on earth. And with that gift he also gave us a promise: our friendship with Christ will bring meaning and partial joy to our lives here on earth, but it will bring us into everlasting joy in heaven.

If we accept God's gift of friendship with Christ, what St Paul calls "grace," then we will have "eternal life" - guaranteed.

- Whoever lives in friendship with Christ lives a fruitful and meaningful life here on earth.
- Whoever dies with that friendship still intact will enter into the eternal adventure of life with God forever in heaven.

If that's not a reason for us to REJOICE!, I don't know what is. Celebrate this day and REJOICE as we are living the Love of Christ.



Good Morning Everyone,

As I'm sure many are aware or have been hearing things about this on the TV or internet, the FDA has approved a third COVID-19 vaccine for emergency use developed by Johnson and Johnson. While having more tools in our belt to help fight the pandemic is a good thing, this one is slightly problematic, as the US Bishops point out in statement released March 1st. (It's very brief and I recommend reading it: <https://www.usccb.org/news/2021/us-bishop-chairmen-doctrine-and-pro-life-address-use-johnson-johnson-covid-19-vaccine>)

As the bishops and the **NCBC note**, there is an ethical hierarchy among the different vaccines. Best are those with no connection to cell lines derived from aborted fetuses. Second are those that are connected to problematic cell lines, but on a more remote level, such as the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines which only used them in confirmatory testing during development. Last are those that are directly connected to cell lines from aborted fetuses that are used in the development, testing, and production of the vaccines. The Johnson and Johnson vaccine fits into this last category (<https://lozierinstitute.org/what-you-need-to-know-about-the-covid-19-vaccine/>).

According to the Church, the pandemic constitutes a sufficiently grave reason to use any of the aforementioned classes of vaccines, however, as I mentioned in a previous email, **we have an obligation to use the least ethically problematic vaccine available**. Therefore, insofar as we have a say in the matter, we ought to avoid the Johnson and Johnson vaccine and opt for the less ethically problematic Pfizer or Moderna vaccines. It's important to mention that the USCCB points out that there are a number of factors that can affect availability, including government controlled distribution, allergies, or any number of other factors beyond our control.

On a final note, the Church has been consistently clear that use of vaccines connected to cell lines from aborted fetuses should only be done "under protest" and that we have a responsibility to voice our opposition to the use of abortion derived cell lines in research and production.


