Greetings of Easter Joy!!,

St. Peter shows amazing courage in today's first reading. That passage is taken from his Pentecost sermon. In that sermon, he preached the gospel to the Jewish leaders and residents of Jerusalem - the very same group of people who had conspired to condemn Jesus to death by crucifixion. Consequently, Peter doesn't sugar-coat his message; he reminds them that: "The author of life you put to death." Wow, he has a strong message.

But then he moves on from their sin, weakness, and ignorance. He lifts their gaze to something much more important. He tells them that God can handle it, that God took the evil of Christ's suffering and death and turned it into the definitive victory over evil, suffering and death: "God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses." And as he said, "we are witnesses," certainly he was thinking of those times, as we heard in today's Gospel, when Jesus appeared to them, letting them see and touch his wounds, proving that he was no ghost or illusion stemming from wishful thinking.

It is Christ's resurrection that has made all the difference. It has dissolved the bonds of original sin and opened the door to a new life, a life in which each of us can truly leave behind the chains of sin and selfishness in all their forms.

The Resurrection is the key that opens the treasure of hope for each of us, no matter how mediocre, hypocritical, or self-absorbed we have been and tend to be. The Resurrection puts all good things within reach: wisdom, patience, joy, fortitude, self-control - in short, it makes holiness and lasting happiness possible for us.

That is what Peter is telling the crowds, and that is what the Church is telling us: hope in Christ, leave everything aside to follow him, and he will work wonders in your life.

## Parenting with Faith

### Jesus Welcomes Children

*Dear Parent,*

*Young children can relate best with others when they first experience love and trust from the people they come into contact the most—parents, teachers, relatives, and friends. Your child will come into contact with Jesus, the ultimate example of love and concern, through these people as well. The following story will help children get to know Jesus as a loving friend. After you read the story aloud, use the questions that follow for discussion on how your child can develop a friendship with Jesus—which will serve as a springboard for them as they learn how to emulate Him in relating to others.*

Jesus spent many hours talking to people about God's love for them and how they could show love for one another. Because Jesus knew and cared for all that His Father created, he cared for all people. Whether He was traveling, or staying in one place, large crowds always gathered from the towns and villages nearby just to hear Him speak. He told great stories, called parables, that taught the people lessons about how to live good, happy lives. Many times parents took their children to see and listen to Jesus.

One day when Jesus finished talking, some children ran up close to Him. They wanted to be near Him—to see His loving smile, and listen and talk with Him. Some grown-up friends of Jesus, however, told the eager children that Jesus was very tired and that they should go away.

But in a kind and gentle voice, Jesus said, "Let the children come to me." He then stretched out his hands to the children and welcomed them to come close to Him. Smiling, Jesus blessed the children and said: "I am never too tired for you. God made all of you, and everything God made is good! I want to be your special friend." (Based on Matthew 19: 13-15 and Luke 18: 15-17)

- What did the children like to do when Jesus finished talking to the grown-ups? (*Run up close to Him to see and talk with Him.*)
- Who told the children to go away? (*Some grown-up friends of Jesus.*)
- Why did some grown-ups tell the children to go away? (*They thought Jesus was too tired to talk to the children.*)
- What did Jesus do to show the children that He welcomed them? (*He reached His hands out to them, smiled, and blessed them.*)
- What do the words "to bless people" mean? (*To wish that God will take care of them and that good things will happen to them.*)
- In our story, what did Jesus say to show love for the children? (*God made the children, and everything God made is good. Jesus said He wants to be their special friend.*)
- How can we show that we are friends of Jesus? (*By being kind and loving to others.*)



## Decree Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

*In Nomine Domini. Amen.*

*Whereas*, due to the severity of the Covid-19 pandemic, on March 17, 2020 I dispensed the faithful of the Diocese of Fargo from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation; and

*Whereas*, circumstances now allow us to attend Mass safely;

*Therefore*, beginning May 1, 2021, the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is reinstated in the Diocese of Fargo.

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe they were recently exposed to Covid-19 or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or a nursing facility; those who care for the sick, the infirm, and the homebound; those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own; those with underlying health conditions or in a high-risk category; and those who have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by attending Mass.

One should consult their pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass.

With an assurance of prayers for the holiness and good health of all, I extend my apostolic blessing to the faithful of the Diocese of Fargo.
