Thank you to those who have responded generously to my announcement of our short fall last week! May God bless you for all that you do and all of your sacrifices for this parish and this school!

We continue to pray and believe in the goodness of God with greater zeal because He works miracles everyday. He also has given us a great treasure in our blessed mother, Mary. Last week, I talked about the powerful prayer of Our Lady Undoer of the Knots. For this week, I want to talk about the beautiful prayer of the rosary. We had our first rosary procession in a long time on the evening of the feast day of Our Lady of Fatima. It was a beautiful day for it as well. A great thank you to those who were involved in making it happen.

I wanted to take the time to talk about how powerful the rosary is when we pray it. The rosary is a prayer that leads us through the life and death of Jesus Christ. It helps us to see Jesus through the eyes of His Mother Mary. She was a model of continual prayer and humility. She was always discerning the Will of God and we see this concretely how she often said yes to God. She said yes to God with great faith even when things seem to be impossible. She said yes to God to become the Mother of God and she was faithful to him in every aspect. I recall those powerful words of Mary at the wedding feast of Cana, she tells Jesus that they have run out of wine and proceeds to tell the servants to do whatever He tells you. This is the lesson of the Holy Rosary that we are able to submit our will to God. We are asking for Mary's help to aid us in this process. The rosary consists of 4 prayers: Apostles Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be followed by the Fatima Prayer. The reason for the repetition of these prayers is that it allows our mind to move to contemplation and meditation. We can engage in a conversation with Mary and ask her to present these needs to Jesus just like we saw with the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana.

It is also a powerful weapon against Satan and Mary made it known when she appeared to St. Dominic with the rosary. St. Padre Pío has been quoted saying that the rosary solves all problems because we are being taught to pray with faith that all will be well when God is in control.



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTAND-ING OF SCRIPTURE

May 22, 2022 6th Sunday of Easter

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: "May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us.'

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, per-©LPi secution, suffering, rejection, and even death.



St. Rita of Cascia | May 22

St. Rita of Cascia (1381 - 1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community. Born in central Italy, St. Rita felt the calling to become a nun, but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow

caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.

Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.






