

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I will be gone next week for a brief rest from May 29 to June 4, 2022 and I will be back for the weekend Masses. For this week's bulletin, I wanted to spend some time talking about the Seven Dolors or Sorrows of Mary. This is a powerful prayer and devotion because there

is nothing more powerful than the prayers of a suffering mother. We are living in a world that seems to be a bit more hostile than welcoming especially when we are living our Catholic Faith and values.

The family has been heavily attacked and especially on the gift of motherhood. We have seen so many tragedies that is connected with this like the vast number of abortions, school shootings and lies of not being a good enough mother. Mother Mary is a great source of comfort for all of us because she has experienced such great pain in raising Jesus but to also see him suffer and die cruelly at the hands of men. Whenever we are plagued by the worries of life and hope seems nowhere to be near. Turn your gaze to our Blessed Mother, she understands and is longing to love and comfort her precious children. The Feast Day of Our Lady of Sorrows began with St. Anselm who introduced the concept in the 11th Century which then gained traction that the Church designated a day for her honor in the 12th century.

In the beginning, the devotion began with three sorrows but it then expanded to four more found on Good Friday which brings us to a total of 7 sorrows.

"By the Fourteenth Century the single sorrow of Mary had been expanded to seven, three from the early years and four from Good Friday. The first three sorrows of Mary are Simeon's painful prediction (Lk 2:35), the panic-stricken Flight into Egypt and the years spent as a refugee (Mt 2:13-15,19-22), and the acute anxiety of losing her son for three days (Lk 2:48). The final four sorrows of Mary are her encounter with Jesus as he carried his Cross, the torment of standing at the foot of the Cross to witness her son's suffering and death (Jn 19:25a), the anguish of receiving his lifeless body in her arms as he was taken down from the Cross, and the grief of watching her son's burial as he was laid in the tomb."

The prayer is called Seven Dolors or Sorrows of Mary and this can be easily found online. I have prayed this prayer numerous times for mothers who are experiencing any difficulties within their lives, their children or even the loss of their children. She has been a great aid to those women and myself as well.

Unity and diversity can exist together. Our western minds have a grave difficulty seeing unity without conformity. We tend to believe that unless everyone believes the same thing, assents to the same body of truths, styles, and opinions, unity is not possible. Jesus, in today's Gospel, expresses a tenderness and an intimacy that the disciples actually can witness. This same tenderness and love are also reflected in his desire for unity and oneness. Jesus passionately wants all to be one. It is very clear that the success of Jesus' mission and the advance of the Gospel rises or falls with whether this unity is achieved. And it is a unity that is achieved around a person and not particulars.

Our church is extremely divided. These divisions all center on various theologies, philosophies, structures, and styles. We allow these particular concerns and interpretations, valid as many can be, to drive wedges between us and put us at odds with each other. They enrage us and cause us to lash out at other members of the Body of Christ. Differences are bound to exist in any group. We are unique and diverse people. Staunchly clinging to particular agendas and ideologies while waving the "we're right, you're wrong" banner as we forge ahead in battle does little to advance the real mission of Christ. We are perceived as weak, fractioned, self-focused and serving, and lacking empathy and love. How can the work of salva-tion be accomplished like this? We sacrifice our credibility. For

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the be-ginning and the end." These words describe exactly who the glorified Christ really is. Jesus wants us to see this glory! Be-lieve this! This is the unifying principle that draws the Body of Christ together as one, not our particular preferences of wor-ship! We give too much power to our preferences, and all too easily forget that the real mission of Christ is much more than that! If we can work at truly loving each other as members of Christ's Body despite the differences that can so quickly divide us, then maybe we'll a bit more convincing to those who do not believe. The Risen Christ comes to us through the Eucharist. It doesn't matter where or how. Gather wherever you can and receive. We cannot substitute Jesus' passion with our own. We are one.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration Notes**

Let us pray in the sanctuary of our hearts and with Jesus in our Adoration chapel: God of mercy and power you destroy war and put down earthly pride. Banish violence from our midst and wipe away our tears, that we may all deserve to be called your sons and daughters. Help us to shape and make a world of justice, peace, and love. Keep in your mercy those men and women who have died in the cause of freedom and bring them safely into your kingdom of justice and peace. We ask this though Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen USCCB

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for

his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.




