THE RECURRING QUESTION

Dear parishioners and visitors at St. Peter,

Man needs relationships in which evil has not succeeded in insinuating suspicion about the goodness of reality, because in them the love of Christ has won. We need this in our life in this new year and always as the newness of Christ that makes all things new. "Behold, I make all things new." Rev 21:5

In this new year and because of a recent reality of the COVID's variant that has been affecting so many people, I thought what Father Giussani, great educator of our time, in *The Religious Sense* - Second Premise: Reasonableness has written: "Man cannot live, however, without moral certainties, without being able to form sure judgements about the behavior of the others toward him. This is so true that uncertainty in relationships is one of the most terrible afflictions of our generation. It is difficult to become certain about relationships, even within the family. We live as if we were seasick, with such insecurity in the fabric of our relationship that we no longer build what is human. We might construct skyscrapers, atomic bombs, the most subtle system of philosophy, but we no longer build the human because it consists of relationships."

Benedict XVI in his pastoral visit in 2006 to Verona, Italy remarked the same idea by saying: "The human person [...] bears within himself, written in the most profound depths of his being, the need for love, to be loved and in turn to love. Therefore, he questions himself and often feels lost before the harshness of life, the evil that exists in the world and that appears so strong and at the same time radically devoid of sense.

Particularly in our age, notwithstanding all the progress made, evil has certainly not been overcome. Indeed, its power seems reinforced and all the attempts to hide it are quickly unveiled, as both daily experience and great historical events demonstrate.

The recurring questions therefore return: Can there be a safe space in our life for authentic love, and in the final analysis, whether the world is truly the work of God's wisdom? Here, much more than any human reason, the upsetting novelty of Biblical revelation comes to our aid: the Creator of Heaven and earth, the one God who is the source of every being, the sole Creator Logos, this creative reason knows how to love man personally, or rather, loves him passionately and wants to be loved in his turn."

Saturday, February 12th, 2022 8am-1pm



Steve Brown - Senior Vice Provost for Academic Administration and Dean of Graduate Studies - The Catholic University of America

I am senior vice provost for academic administration and dean of graduate studies and professor of mechanical engineering at The Catholic University of

America. My research interests include refrigeration and air conditioning, alternative refrigeration cycles, alternative refrigerants, organic Rankine cycles, alternative energy, thermodynamic modeling, two phase heat transfer, human thermal comfort modeling, and bio heat transfer.

In addition to 20+ years of teaching, research, and administrative experience at The Catholic University of America, I have nearly six years of experience working in the automotive industry, nearly two years of experience in a high-volume consumer products manufacturing facility, and have engaged in research and consulting work for NIST, NASA, ASHRAE, Ford Motor Company, DuPont, Dakota Consulting, KTC Consulting, Energetics Technologies Center, Chaberton, Consulting, and Thar Technologies.

I have provided expert testimony in four IPR proceedings, two PGR proceedings, one inter parties reexamination proceeding, and two District Court actions. In addition to these matters, I also have provided consulting services to law firms related to issues surrounding several patents.
