Dear Friends in Christ,

March 3, 2021

When public Masses began on Pentecost Sunday (May 30-31, 2020), the Diocese had three key guidelines regarding occupancy:

- 25% seating capacity
- pew spacing (every-other-pew was mandated; every-third-pew was ideal)
- physical distancing

At that time, masks were encouraged, not mandated. Since masks weren't mandated and our church is so large, we reached for the ideal: every-third-pew.

25% seating capacity at MMOC is approximately 220 people. However, physical distancing has priority over seating capacity, which means our church is "full" when we reach 115-130 people depending on whether a family arrives to fill a pew or not. For example, a pew that seats a household of 8 only seats 3 singles who are spaced apart.

Once our church is "full," we direct people to the Parish Hall and this has become more common for a variety of reasons, among them...

- the desire to attend Mass during Lent
- covid19 cases are declining
- a return to normalcy after being vaccinated

Recently, the La Crosse County Health Department has raised the suggested capacity restriction from 25% to 50% with the understanding that physical distancing is the first priority. This means we can seat 440 in our church, but we struggle to reach 140. In the Parish Hall, our capacity would increase from 75 to 150 but we would probably be "full" before we reach 100.

Seeing capacity restrictions raised is a small sign we are moving toward normalcy. At some point, the Sunday Mass obligation will also return. Additionally, the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), the federal government, and local school districts have been working to re-open schools for in-person instruction. Aquinas Catholic Schools has done this successfully in Grades K-8 since the start of the school year and are transitioning to full-time, in-person instruction in the high school by March 15 instead of the blended option they have done for Grades 9-12 since August. There are positive movements afoot.

I am considering the following change in March: **Seating every-other-pew rather than every-third-pew.**

Rationale:

- Participating in Mass from the Parish Hall is not the same.
- To my knowledge, the vast majority of parishes began with every-other-pew.
- No Mass in a diocesan church has become a "spreading event," so every-other-pew has been working.
- Masks will remain mandatory.
- Pews will continue to be sanitized after every Mass.
- The air is cleaner than ever: Our new ventilation systems include ion generators. As the air in church (and Parish Hall) passes through the return vents, ions attach to dust, bacteria, viruses, etc. These ions kill living organisms and make every particle (including miniscule viruses) larger, which means the air filters capture them more easily before the air mixes with additional outdoor air and cycles through the church.

Our church attendance has increased and we have been seating people in the Parish Hall at the 4 PM & 10 AM Masses. Many enjoy the experience of the Parish Hall, others say, "It's not the same," and a few have elected to return home to view Mass instead of sitting in the Parish Hall. While many of us believe "at least you get to receive Holy Communion in the Parish Hall" – and those who return home would likely admit it, too! – it's a sign of the natural discouragement when "going to church" feels like "not going to church." Additionally, some people in the pews have noted the large, empty spaces and wish those in the Parish Hall could be accommodated.

At some point we will make the change to every-other-pew. Is this the right time to make the change? Next week there will be a simple survey for those who attend church:

**Building our Future Together**

In this column, we have been reviewing our 2021 Building Our Future Together projects. “Sealing the Building Shell – Church and Rectory,” and “Church Interior Renovations” were previously explored. Another 2021 project we will accomplish is “Rectory Interior Renovations.” This project includes repairing water-damaged plaster areas around windows, other plaster repairs from water damage not related to windows, bathroom renovations, painting interior walls, repairing flooring and replacing carpet. This 2021 project is projected to cost \$165,385.

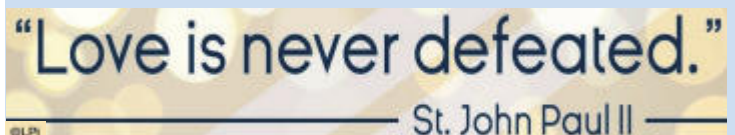
Most of the window openings have some measure of plaster bubbling and flaking. With the installation last year of new roofing and this year’s scheduled installation of new windows, we are optimistic water infiltration will be abated. The aluminum, commercial-type windows are being crafted by Glass Service Center, La Crosse. The 40 new windows will be “breathable” and will have “weep” holes to permit moisture to escape outside to avoid interior build-up and damage. Other re-plastering and repairs are in ceilings and walls not necessarily near windows but from water infiltration and damage that has occurred over the past 60 years. For example, a wood paneled accent wall in the living room has serious water damage.

Three full-bathrooms and two half-bathrooms will be renovated. The full baths will have tubs replaced with showers. These five bathrooms will have vanity sinks replaced. Old florescent lighting will be replaced with new lighting fixtures. Moisture damage repairs will be made to affected plaster, and in two bathrooms, repairs will be made to floors. Repainting will complete the bathroom renovations.

Repainting the interior walls and replacing carpet will complete the rectory interior renovations. The plaster repairs are the main reason for repainting. Much of the carpet is nearly 20 and 35 years old, and the rectory living room has the original carpet and décor from 1960.

All of the cost estimates we used again this week are the same cost estimates we have previously published. However, we are hopeful to receive firm prices over the next week so we will be able to confirm contracts. Some contractors have been revisiting our campus to confirm the scope of these projects. We will advise any new or revised costs as we are able.

We continue to anticipate the 2021 projects will begin in early May and run until fall. Thank you for your faithfulness in keeping current with pledges to our building projects. Please keep our parish and the success of this year’s projects in your prayers as we Build Our Future Together.
