Dear Friends in Christ,

March 17, 2021

Thank you to everyone who completed a survey last weekend. Of the 209 responses, 96.2% (201 responses) said they would continue to attend church if we adjusted our pew spacing to every-other-pew this month.

3.8% (8 responses) said they would not attend. However, most said they would attend as soon as they completed their vaccinations and some thought it would be advisable to wait another 1-2 months so more of our population will be vaccinated.

The results provide added confidence to make the change for this coming weekend March 20-21.

The rationale previously provided for the survey has become the rationale for making the change at this time:

- The Parish Hall has been used consistently at the 4 PM and 10 AM Masses and it's not conducive for the same level of involvement and participation.
- To my knowledge, the vast majority of parishes began with every-other-pew.
- No Mass in a diocesan church has become a "spreading event," so every-other-pew has been working.
- Masks will remain mandatory.
- Pews will continue to be sanitized after every Mass.
- The air is cleaner than ever: Our new ventilation systems include ion generators. As the air in church (and Parish Hall) passes through the return vents, ions attach to dust, bacteria, viruses, etc. These ions kill living organisms and make every particle (including miniscule viruses) larger, which means the air filters capture them more easily before the air mixes with additional outdoor air and cycles through the church.

We will continue to follow the protocols provided by the Diocese and the La Crosse County Health Department:

- 50% capacity restrictions with the understanding that physical distancing is the priority.
- Masks are required and should be properly worn so they fit above the nose.
- Those who feel ill should remain at home.

The Sunday Mass obligation is still suspended, so viable options include viewing at home (via live stream or on KQEG) and/or attending 7:30 AM weekday Masses, which typically have 30-40 people participating.

Our church attendance has risen to 50% of previous years. In the first 4 Sundays of Lent, the attendance average has been...

4 PM: 185 people
8 AM: 110 people
10 AM: 160 people

Even with this new seating arrangement, it's likely we will be using the Parish Hall at the 4 PM and 10 AM Masses. Everyone is asked to follow the directions of our Greeters for fair spacing and seating. We will not be offering reservations for "favorite seating" or be offering the privilege to enforce one's own spacing preference. Those who arrive less than 5 minutes before Mass are still likely to find church to be "full" and then directed to the Parish Hall, but we want to do our best to use our church pews well.

For Holy Week, we will be offering a 2nd Good Friday service and a third Mass on Easter Sunday. (It is not permissible to offer a 2nd Mass on Holy Thursday or the Easter Vigil; however, our 50% church attendance rates suggest neither would be needed.) Please check the bulletin for the full Easter Triduum schedule. During April, we will be celebrating First Communion at a Sunday afternoon Mass and we will do the same for Confirmation Mass.

Please pray for the end of the pandemic and for those who are most impacted by its effects.

U.S. Bishops' cite ethical problem with Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 Vaccine The U.S. Bishops, citing the Vatican Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, have judged that, if one can choose among equally safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines, the vaccine with the least connection to abortion-derived cell lines should be chosen. While the vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna did use an abortion-derived cell line for testing, they did not use the problematic cell line in their vaccine development and production. By contrast, the Johnson & Johnson vaccine was developed, tested and produced with abortion-derived cell lines, raising additional moral concerns. Therefore, if one has the ability to choose a vaccine, Pfizer or Moderna's vaccines should be chosen over Johnson & Johnson's. Sadly, when it comes to a number of vital vaccines – such as the one for Rubella – there is no other choice than either to make use of a tainted vaccine or to forgo vaccination altogether. Building our Future Together

Through several Sunday bulletins, we have outlined the 2021 projects we plan to accomplish. We have identified these various projects as “bundles” for ease in reference. Summarily, the bundles are:

Sealing the Building Shell: Church & Rectory: including Masonry Restoration, Stained Glass Window Strengthening. Rectory Window Demolition, Replacement and Plaster Repairs.

Rectory Interior Renovations: including Renovate Rectory Bathrooms (including) Demolition, Plumbing, Electrical; Plaster Repairs, Carpeting, Small Carpentry Repairs, and Painting.

Church Interior Renovations: including Refinishing Pews, Repairs to Terrazzo flooring, Polish & Refinish Floors, Ceiling Grill Removal and Paint, Repair Plaster Window Areas, Paint Church Ceiling, Install new doors in the Sacristy Closets, Safety/Visual for Lower Sanctuary Step.

Other Items: Tractor and Broom for Parish Maintenance, New Office Phone System. In addition, General Construction Conditions, Construction Management Fee (3%), and a Construction Contingency Allowance (8%).

The total cost of the 2021 projects is expected to be under \$900,000. We are continuing to experience possible cost variances in some areas due to the scope of the projects, i.e. remodeling. For example, removing a window for an exact replacement measurement exposed a possible water run-off issue that may require removing the limestone panels above the windows to make repairs and then re-installing the limestone. Wherever possible, we are also exploring alternatives that may save project costs. We continue to be confident the 2021 projects will be less than \$900,000.

On March 10, we experienced a storm that had very significant, sustained SW driving winds. Upon inspection the next morning, we were pleased that there was no rain infiltration in the church, including the sacristy roof areas on the south and north side of the sanctuary. The new roofs in the rectory also remained sealed. The only infiltration occurred in a chronic area in the rectory kitchen. That area will be addressed this year with exit door repairs on the 2nd floor and masonry restoration.

We continue to anticipate the 2021 projects will begin in early May and run until fall. Thank you for your faithfulness in keeping current with pledges to our building projects. Please keep our parish and the success of this year’s projects in your prayers as we Build Our Future Together.
