USCCB Statement on Vaccines On December 14, Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Doctrine, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement on the new COVID-19 vaccines. In their statement, the bishops address the moral concerns raised by the fact that the three vaccines that appear to be ready for distribution in the United States all have some connection to cell lines that originated with tissue taken from abortions.

With regard to the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, they concluded:

"In view of the gravity of the current pandemic and

the lack of availability of alternative vaccines, the reasons to accept the new COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna are sufficiently serious to justify their use, despite their remote connection to morally compromised cell lines.

"Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good."

With regard to the AstraZeneca vaccine, the bishops found it to be "more morally compromised" and consequently concluded that this vaccine "should be avoided" if there are alternatives available. "It may turn out, however, that one does not really have a choice of vaccine, at least, not without a lengthy delay in immunization that may have serious consequences for one's health and the health of others," the bishop chairmen stated. "In such a case ... it would be permissible to accept the AstraZeneca vaccine."

At the same time, the bishops also warned that Catholics "must be on guard so that the new COVID-19 vaccines do not desensitize us or weaken our determination to oppose the evil of abortion itself and the subsequent use of fetal cells in research.

Houska Park Meals for the Homeless A small group of volunteers has been looking for volunteer groups to help provide one hot meal per day through at least September, perhaps October, at Houska Park for our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Here are some details:

- Approximately 90 meals are needed each day.
- Water and/or beverages are very welcomed as there is only one water fountain in the park.
- There are two coolers (that remain in the park) available for beverages leftovers. Please bring ice if you are able (there is an ice machine in the parish hall).
- Meals can be pre-packed in individual serving containers or served buffet style. Leftover food may be placed in individual storage containers and left in coolers with ice.
- Groups should bring all needed disposable plates, silverware and napkins, and trash bags. There is no storage facility in the park.
- All serving dishes, utensils, and any food that cannot be properly stored in the coolers for later use must be taken out of the park when the mealtime ends.
- At least 4 volunteers should assist with serving the meal (including handing out pre-packaged meals).
- Any type of food may be prepared for the meal. Hot food, hot dogs, BBQ, tacos, or hot dishes are popular choices. Fruit (e.g. watermelon or cantaloupe) is also popular. Ice and water are essential. (Desserts are optional, there are several businesses who bring leftover donuts and cookies.)
- 2 – 6' tables are needed for serving food. Volunteers need to bring and remove the tables. (The parish has 2 tables that can be used for the meals.)
- Mealtime is 5:30 to about 6:30 or 7:00.
- There are NO attendants or organizational people present. There is a group of homeless who typically help or advise how things should go

We will begin providing meals on Wednesday, August 25. Thank you to those who have already volunteered and those who have donated money to help purchase food.

Building Our Future Together

Last week we reported some of the history and cost estimates for repairs/improvements to our pipe organ. We observed that the new estimates are far above our original budget expectations and our need to explore other options. Summarily, the minimum repairs/improvements include a completely new organ console (i.e. keyboard), new blower motor, a new relay panel in the pipe chamber, and repairs to the shutters in the enclosure housing pipes. Additional recommendations include cleaning and re-voicing the organ pipes, and adding additional pipes starting with a softer Pedal base. All of these items, the minimum repairs and/or the recommended options, are expensive and necessary to return our instrument to functionality.

Earlier this year we began giving consideration to the possibility of replacing our pipe organ with a new digital organ. A new digital instrument (e.g. a Rodgers Organ or an Allen Organ) would be much less costly than even the minimum repairs needed for the pipe organ, and they do not require expensive semi-annual tuning. We have been gathering information and pricing on new digital organs.

In June, we engaged the services of a pipe organ builder/consultant, J. Lindsay & Co., Madison, WI to meet with us and make recommendations on how we might proceed with our organ repairs/improvements. Mr. Lindsay played the pipe organ and acknowledged all the issues and needs that were evident. We discussed what our needs and objectives are for our parish music program. Hearing that we wanted to maintain both traditional and contemporary church harmony and music for

Mass (i.e. we really are not focused on hosting concerts or recitals), he affirmed our earlier thoughts and suggested we abandon the pipe organ and purchase a new, state of the art digital organ. We were surprised by his recommendation since he is a pipe organ builder by trade and profession and appreciated his positive affirmation of our earlier thoughts.

When considering the purchase of an organ the first consideration is sound. New digital organs have an amazing sound. Most people cannot distinguish the sound of a digital instrument from a pipe organ. Digital organ builders have individually recorded the sound of thousands of independent, unique organ pipes. When the various digital recordings are brought together, the distinctive pipe organ sound is heard whether you are hearing a standard like Holy God We Praise Thy Name, a Christmas O Come All Ye Faithful, an Easter Jesus Christ is Risen Today, or a solo Ave Maria.

Preliminary quotes for a new digital organ suggest we will be well under our original budget of \$74,500 – perhaps \$50,000! New digital instruments are generally custom built with a 4-6 month lead-time. That would work out well as we would be looking for the new organ to be the final item on next year's BOFT schedule of renovating the choir loft. We will have more information on organ possibilities in next week's bulletin. Please keep our parish and the success of this year's projects in your prayers as we Build Our Future Together.
