### **Building Our Future Together**

All musical instruments play a unique role in the liturgical life of our church. In 2018 we were blessed with a gift of a grand piano for the main level. In 2022 we will be blessed with a gift of another grand piano and a new organ for the choir loft. After much research, we decided to go with a digital organ over a pipe organ.

In November we tried two different digital organs in our space each for two weeks. While two weeks is not nearly enough time to become completely acclimated with an instrument or to fine-tune the instrument for our space, it did give us a good feel for each organ. Both organs were very nice instruments and each one had its strengths.

We put out a survey to our musicians and choir members asking for feedback. The results were split, some preferred the Rodgers organ, while others preferred the Allen. Both instruments would have been a great addition to our music program. We paid particular attention to the musician's feedback as they will be the ones playing the organ in the future. We learned musicians liked features from both organs, such as rocker stops which light up to let you know they are on, three manuals (or keyboards), and the Allen organ's general design.

After much research, thought, and prayer we have decided to purchase an Allen organ. Allen does have an organ in stock that meets our needs and includes many of the features which the musicians found they liked from both instruments.

Financially, the two instruments were virtually the same cost. Gratefully, through the generosity of an anonymous donor, the entire cost was covered. Thus the organ

choice was able to be made on our evaluation and preference of the various qualities and features of the instrument. The Allen organ company will hold this instrument for us until we are ready to put it in the choir loft. Music ministry is looking forward to the choir loft remodel project and the new instruments!
