Casting a Vision for the Parish

MMOC TV Mass

WKBT is the new owner and manager of KQEG. They are unable to broadcast our online TV Mass live the way KQEG would do it. Our two options are 1) record a Sunday Mass earlier in the week or 2) broadcast Mass on a one-week delay. As an example, in order to broadcast our Easter Sunday Mass our church would need to be decorated for Easter during Holy Week for recording or we would need to broadcast Palm Sunday on Easter Sunday. Neither option isn't practical.

Building Our Future Together

The December 19 bulletin listed a number of projects to be accomplished in 2022 to address the final part of Phase IV of Building Our Future Together. The major emphasis is on the church entrance (narthex), church restrooms, and choir loft. After meetings on December 14 and 16, we can share these layouts to help visualize the renovations. This bulletin will focus on the main floor and next weekend's article will focus on the choir loft.

The restrooms will be renovated in the same style as the restrooms in the Parish Hall (and Religious Education Center). The doors will be widened and have mechanical entries. Both will have a 2nd commode installed. The plumbing will impact the terrazzo floor and require new flooring. This will be an improvement because the new flooring will be easier to clean. The automated faucets will be replaced with manual.

The large vanity closet in the Bridal Room (Mother's Room) will be modified because that space will be needed to expand the Women's Restroom on the other side of the wall. The vanity closet will be replaced by a tri-fold mirror cabinet with an overhead light. The hall-way to the Women's Restroom will also be incorporated into the enlarged restroom. There will be a door from the Bridal/Mother's Room which will only be accessible during weddings.

Opposite the Men's restroom wall, a platform lift (not an elevator) will be installed to create access to the choir loft above. This will require the hospitality counter to be relocated and shortened. On the east side of the lift, a closet will be installed; on the west side, a small counter will be added.


The confessionals will be updated with new flooring, walls, ceiling, and improved ventilation.

The terrazzo flooring in the gathering space will be cleaned and sealed, including the steps to the choir loft and the two sacristies in the front of church.

The ambo-pulpit in the sanctuary will be moved approximately 4½-ft toward the center of the sanctuary in order to provide a sightline for the pianist and more space for a small musical ensemble.

Our current timeline anticipates these renovations to begin after Easter (about May 1).
