From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends of Christ in Collegetown and St. Joe:

The two parishes have representatives that have worked to discover how we can cooperate and reach our desired goals: mass times and pastoral availability. In discussion with the parish counsel and trustees of St. John the Baptist we have decided that beginning the first of September through May we will have masses at 8:30 Sunday mornings. From June to September we will revert to Saturday evening masses. These decisions are made with farmers in mind who have chores in the evenings that keep them away from the Saturday masses and also how to provide the faith formation families with masses on Sundays. We are aware of young families who want to bring their children to Faith Formation but who can't count on their being a mass celebrated. We felt that in order to be clear and regular we should have only the Sunday morning masses every Sunday.

I want to thank the women in St. Joe who have made dresses for children in Tanzania. Fr. Nick said that they were very well received. He has provided a "flash drive" with photos from the Benedictine sisters at the orphanage. Great missionary work ladies! I have noticed that this past week was the beginning of quilting season already. The great force behind this work of course is Del Rose Fischer. They have paid for a great number of items in for the parish as well as cash from their auctions. They have been a wonderful resource for St. Joe parish. Any women from either parish who would like to participate are welcome. Del Rose will be happy to help new-bees learn the tricks of the trade. Thank you, Roger Henkemeyer, for your continual service as painter. He is currently painting the former meeting room in the parish rectory. Things are buzzing around here as we re-configure some of our office space in order to have the parish staff in one location. Marian Bach gave up her beautiful office in the school building, but we are excited to have her and Sister Betty here with us in the rectory. Now all of the parishioners will know where to find us.

- Community Gardens Training in partnership with the Monastery of St. Benedict.
- Summer activities in the park for the children of the community.
- Women's Acculturation Group in partnership with Resurrection Lutheran Church.
- Ongoing visits with the families keep new friendships going and encourage trust and growth in positive relationships.
- Education in cooperation of the College of St. Benedict, the Church of St. Joseph, and Resurrection Lutheran Church including presentations, potlucks, and Circles of Understanding.

A liaison from the Church of St. Joseph will serve on the Steering Committee which meets monthly. This position gives updates to the pastor and parish administrator of activities and growth in our outreach to our newer community members.

Gospel Reflection for August 10th

“Where your treasure is, there also will be your heart.”

These words from the Gospel reading for this Sunday set the tone for all of the three readings. The gift of faith is central to our growth as Christians, as is told in the story of Abraham in the reading from Hebrews. The definition of faith: “Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen,” challenges us to look into our hearts and recognize the gift of faith we have received in Baptism, and which is strengthened at Confirmation and every time we receive the Eucharist.

How do we build up “treasure in heaven?” Our treasure is built up by the ways we carry out God’s plan for us. Sometimes this plan does not make a lot of sense, but that is where the gift of faith comes in. God’s plan calls us to be of service to others and to be prepared when he comes to call us home. God does not ask us to sit around and wait, but rather to be carrying out his will in our lives.

What is the service God calls us to while we are here on this earth? We are called to share the earthly treasure that we have with those who have less! We will be judged on the response we give to this call to service. It is through this tangible service of others that we will build up treasure in heaven.

The gifts we have to share are the gifts of time, talent and treasure. Take time this week to find one way in which you can share each of these gifts! For example, time – volunteering at the parish or in the community, or just doing something special for your family at home.; talent – taking part in parish services, or reaching out to the homebound; treasure – assess your ability to share financial help with donations to the parish or other organizations that assist the needy.

May this week be a time for you to build treasure in heaven! Blessings on your week!

Gospel Reflection for August 18th

In the Gospel today Jesus tells us that he came to set the earth on fire. In the Old Testament, fire symbolizes God’s presence – the burning bush, Elijah’s sacrifice, the flames on the Apostles at Pentecost. Fire is also a symbol of purification. When the fire of God’s Spirit fills us, we are purified of what ever keeps us from a deep relationship with God. The purification can cause pain as we let go of selfishness and whatever keeps us from God. The key of Jesus message today is that our relationship with God is the most important relationship. Are there times when our relationship with others – family, friends, community keep us from God? It is at these times when we need to focus on Jesus and what he is calling us to do and be in this life.

This week take time to reflect on ways to keep your focus on Jesus – through prayer and action. Take time to pray with your family and as a family give something to the Food Shelf or other needy groups. Review your relationships; are they filling you with the Spirit or are they leading you away from Jesus?
