The Willing Hands group meets each week. Together, they create cards for purchase and for parish use.

If you would like to join in this ministry, you are always welcome to come to Heritage Hall on Wednesdays from 10:00 to 12:30 am. You'll often find coffee and homemade treats to enjoy while you work!

Willing Hands would like to provide the following message: "THANK YOU THANK YOU THANK YOU for your support in purchasing our greeting cards. With your support, we were able to donate \$150.00 to the Faith Formation program. That's 150 greeting cards sold!

Since January, with your support, we were able to buy supplies to make over 400 greeting cards for parish use. The parish office uses our cards to send to parishioners who have recently celebrated a sacrament, experienced a loss or hardship, or are celebrating a milestone!"

### Funeral Lunches

Mary Kay Kern, funeral lunch organizer, provides insight about this important ministry:

"I have been getting several questions about the cost of our luncheons and the available choices.

We have five main choices:

'Funeral' hot dish, scalloped potatoes, sloppy joes, tuna noodle hot dish and cold sandwiches.

Along with these main courses we usually serve:

- Fruit salad (fresh fruit in the summer)
- Coleslaw or fresh vegetables and dip
- Pickles
- Chips
- Cake
- Coffee, milk and water
- Bread & sandwich fixings

We appreciate when a family is specific when planning. This allows us to accommodate their requests and needs.

As far as cost is concerned, the meals usually run between \$3-\$4 per plate, depending on meal choice. This is very reasonable for the quantity and quality of the meals served. Families also take home any leftovers.

You may have received a call to supplement the cost of the meals. This is greatly appreciated by the families and shows parish support during such a difficult time.

We have a great group of volunteers who help to serve a tasty meal to the family and their guests."

**Gospel Reflection for September 22nd**

In the letter from Paul to Timothy this week, he reminds us to pray for everyone – those in authority, and in leadership in our community and in our world. “It is my wish, that in every place all should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument.”

In the Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the steward who was wise in protecting himself from the anger of the rich property owner. This parable follows closely on one of the two sons of last weeks Gospel. In both cases the rich man or the father do not chastise those who have a different priority in life. He calls them to look at the reality of life with Him. The prodigal son is welcomed back and the dishonest steward is praised for acting prudently. Does this mean that Jesus approves of their way of acting? No! He calls them back to live an honest life by recognizing their sinfulness and renewing a relationship with Him. He showers them with his love rather than his anger.

This week we are challenged to set our priorities straight. As Jesus says, “we cannot serve two masters.” It is our challenge to follow Christ and to continue to develop our relationship with Him through prayer and works of charity.
