### Parish Quilters—THANK YOU, THANK YOU!

I want to thank the Quilters and the Quilt Cooks for the many, many years put in making quilts for the 4th of July auction or cooking for us.

Since 1996, the quilt auction has brought in from \$9,000 to \$13,000 each year with no expense to the parish. All expenses are covered through funds earned by volunteers who work at Saint John's University for weddings, funerals, etc. The quilters earn a per-hour stipend for each volunteer, and these funds are used for fabric (around \$13/yard) and anything else that is needed to have a successful auction.

If, through the volunteer work at Saint John's University, we have additional funds, we assist in expenses outside of the parish budget. In the past, quilter funds have purchased choir chairs, outdoor lights along the sidewalk and in front of the parish house, parish house furniture and lighting, parish house washer and dryer, albs for servers and vestments for priests.

Quilts cost anywhere from \$125 to \$250 to make, not including the batting or the thread, and are pieced by volunteers. Currently, Patty Loehlein, Llois Warnert, Batty Schloemer, Ilene Schmitt, Marilyn Brinkman and Linda Loso piece quilt tops. We have also had some tops donated.

All funds raised through the quilt auction go into the proceeds from the festival which are used for operational needs and building updates.

We need more volunteers for a few areas:

- **Cooks for a noon meal for the quilters.**
  - Meals are needed on Mondays at Noon
  - The menu is up to the cook.
  - Judy Meemken serves and cleans up the lunch.
  - Reimbursement is possible
  - Thank you to our current cooks, Mary Kay Kern, Shirley Miller, Pat Osbourn, Elaine Eisenschenk, Delores Giroux, Tom & Sharon Steil and Meg Klecker.
- **Dining Room Workers—On-The-Line at SJU**
  - Two people needed every Monday and Thursday at 4:30 pm in the student dining room at SJU
  - Choose one night—or many nights—now through the middle of December.
  - Thank you to previous volunteers with on-the-line experience: Margy Hughes, Karen & Dan Wippler, Delores Giroux, Harold Brinkman, Ron & Maryann Rennie, Linda Loso and Sharon Froelich.

**Gospel Reflection for September 29th**

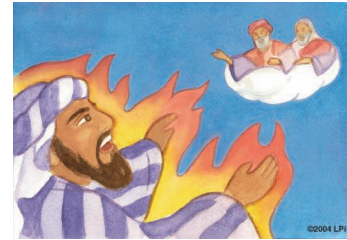
Today's Gospel is the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man has everything he wants, while Lazarus is very poor and is lying at the door of the rich man willing to eat what falls from his table.

In the second part of the parable both have died and the rich man is in torment and Lazarus is happy. The rich man wants Abraham to send Lazarus back to life to tell his brothers about their fate if they refuse to care for the poor. Abraham does not do this because they have the Scriptures to teach them.

What is the message for us who also have the example of Jesus in relating to the poor? Who are the poor today? The poor are those who have less than what they need to live. They can also be poor in having a physical disability, a mental illness or a lack of faith. How do we reach out to them and show them that others care for them? Sometimes it can mean just a pleasant word, or a reminder that they are loved by us and by God.

This week ask yourself: who are the poor that I meet each day? What can I do to help them or to encourage them?
