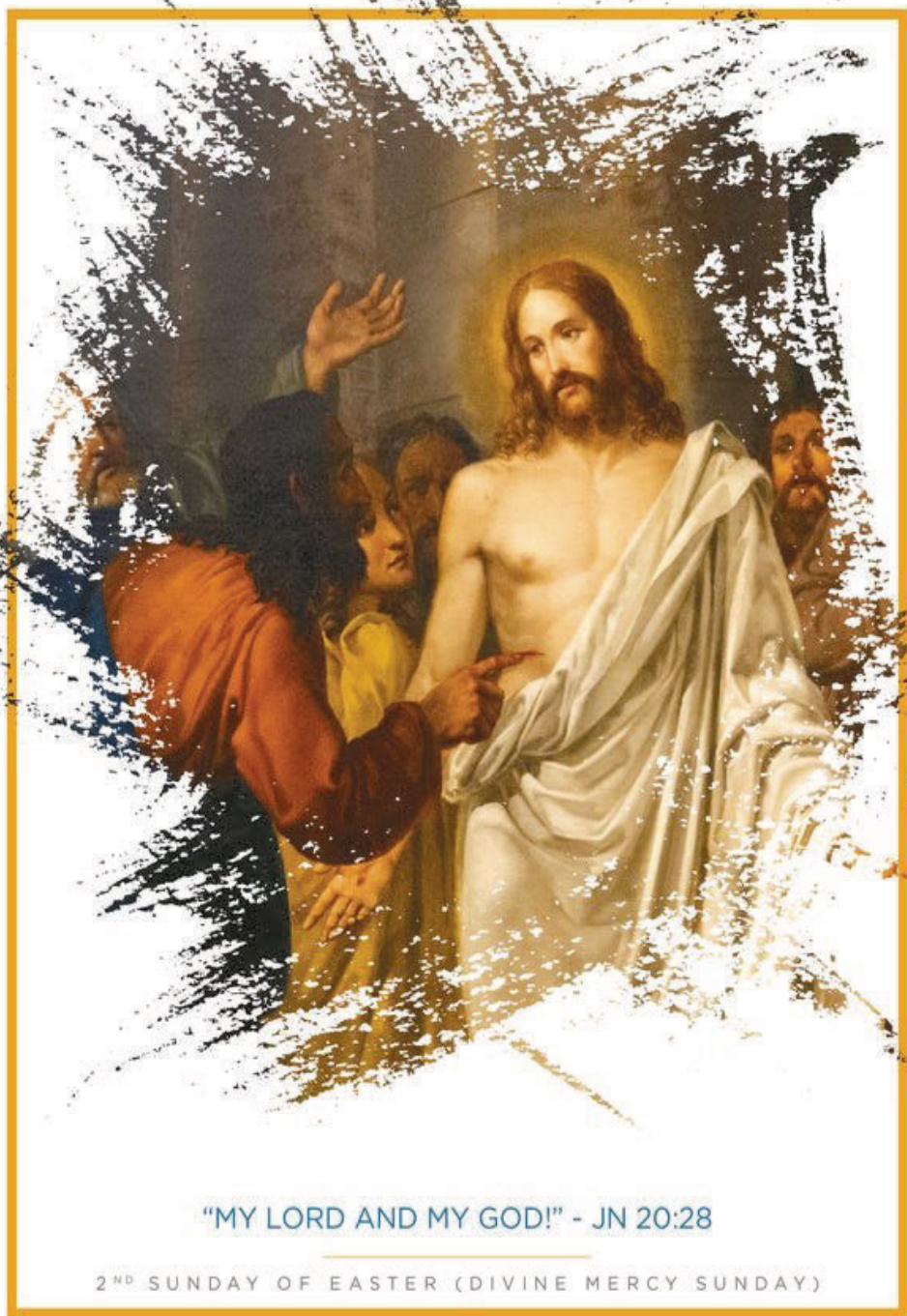

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Second Sunday of Easter

On this Second Sunday of Easter, we find the disciples of Jesus behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jews. They had witnessed Jesus' suffering and death; thus came the fear. Jesus came and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you!" He then showed them his hands and side. Again, Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you.... Receive the Holy Spirit..." With these words he gave the command to go out to the people in the area and spread the news of Jesus' resurrection. However, Thomas was not with them and would not believe that Jesus had appeared to them. A week later Thomas was with them and the doors were locked. Jesus came and said, "Peace be with you! Then Jesus challenged Thomas' disbelief to which Thomas said to Jesus, "My Lord and My God!" This week take time to sit with Jesus and thank him for his death and resurrection which is the source of our forgiveness and eternal life. Have you ever reacted like Thomas and failed to believe? Take time to affirm your faith as you did on Easter.

St. John the Baptist Sesquicentennial Reflecting on 150 Years: Sesquicentennial Tidbit:
-**April 27th:** Join us on Sunday, April 27th following 8:30 am Mass for part 2 of Peggy Roske's History of our Parish presentation in Mary Chapel.

Sesquicentennial Saint: **by Noah Eisenschenk, grade 7**

St. Lawrence: He was one of seven deacons in charge of helping the poor and needy. When Emperor Valerian tried to bribe Lawrence by telling him to gather all the church's gold and silver, Lawrence gathered all the poor, handicapped, and misfortunate to come together. He told the emperor that these people were the church's treasures. This angered the emperor so much that he ordered Lawrence to be burned alive, in public, on a griddle. Lawrence laughed at the executioners. He is the patron saint of Rome, students, poor people, cooks, and comedians. His feast day is August 10th.

Prayer: Dear St. Lawrence, you did many great deeds. I think you are the best saint. Amen.

Person in the Cemetery with a similar name: **Lawrence Eisenschenk**, was my great grandfather. He was a farmer who worked the land. He attended church regularly with his wife, Elizabeth. Many of his children became members of the parish: Gene Eisenschenk, Ron Eisenschenk, Dorothy Notsch, and Mark Eisenschenk. His house still stands and is owned by Charlie Ward.
