

HAPPY EPIPHANY – BLESSING HOMES WITH CHALK



Each year on the Feast of the Epiphany, many parishes throughout the world participate in an annual blessing of chalk. It is an ancient tradition that not only places God at the entrance of your home, but also places your entire family under His protection. The Epiphany blessing of chalk and homes is a centuries old tradition where priests would visit each home in their parish after the Feast of the Epiphany. Over time it became more difficult to accomplish such a feat as parishes

became larger and larger and priests were stretched thin. For this reason, it became an accepted tradition that a member of the household invokes this blessing as a leader in their domestic church by virtue of their baptismal priesthood.

This weekend, we will distribute blessed chalk after the Masses with instructions for how to bless your homes. It is a beautiful blessing, one that brings many graces upon those who practice it in faith and it is an added protection against any spiritual enemies that may be lurking around.



Bishop Robert Barron paints a beautiful and mysterious image of what it takes to be a follower of Jesus Christ. He lays out three intriguing paths to holiness:


- 1. Finding the Center

- 3. Realizing Your Life is Not About You


He also shares practical approaches to enhance the journey along these three paths. Untold Blessing: The Three Paths to Holiness provides an insightful guide as you walk "The Way."

INTERESTING INFORMATION ON THE THREE WISE MEN

1. How many kings were there?

Nowadays in various parts of the world it is recognized and thought that they were three wise men, but are we sure of it? Not really.

The evangelist Saint Matthew does not mention the total of these famous visitors, he only tells us that they were "magicians".

He does not specify the amount. So why do they say there were three? Because of the number of gifts, and because our Holy Mother Church teaches it and we must concur.

2. What were their names?

This data is not found in the Holy Scriptures either, it was the Catholic Church that after the 7th century, following the data of the Magi, took these three names from the book of Martyrology, and there we find slight variations in the names: Gaspar, Melchor and Baltasar.

3. Where did they come from?

The Scripture tells us that they were from the East, (Cf. Mt 2,1) originating from the land today known as Iran, where they constituted a priestly class. The Magi had acquired great influence in Babylon (now Iraq).

Their status as kings has no historical foundation. This seems to be deduced from a psalm that says: "The kings of Tarshish and the Isles will offer Him their gifts; the kings of Arabia, Saba will bring gifts to Him". (Cf. Psalm 72, 10-11)

4. How did they get to Belen?

As children, our parents taught us that the wise men traveled through the desert on some very peculiar animals: an elephant, a camel, and a horse.

But according to the Italian historian Franco Cardini, author of the book The Three Wise Men, History and Legend, Cardini indicates, Saint Augustine deduced that the Kings must have ridden on dromedaries "because he was African, and he knew they were faster than camels."

Later, the church continued the tradition that these peculiar characters traveled on an elephant, a camel, and a horse, until today.

5. Were they magicians, priests, or doctors?

Saint Matthew, the only one who speaks of the Magi in the Bible, explains that they were from "the east", an area that for the Jews were the territories of Arabia, Persia, or Chaldea. On the other hand, the Orientals called the doctors "magicians".


"Magician" in the Persian language meant "priest" and precisely the magicians ("magoi" in Greek) were a caste of Persian or Babylonian priests. They did not know divine revelation like the Jews, but they studied the stars in their desire to seek God.




