Fr. Chad's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

PANDEMIC UPDATE

As I announced at Masses last Sunday, the ongoing pandemic has recently affected many priests and parishes in our Archdiocese, with nearly two dozen priests testing positive for COVID-19 and unavailable to celebrate Masses at their parish. I have remained healthy, but I recognize that I could also be sidelined due to illness. In-person Masses at St. Jude of the Lake will continue unless I am ill and unable to find a priest substitute. We will notify the parish immediately via Flocknote, social media, and the parish website if any cancellations occur. I also encourage everyone to take regular health precautions as the risk of illness increases. If you would like to observe greater social distance during Mass, I encourage you to sit in the balcony.

This is an opportune time to remind you that persons are excused from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays or Holy Days under certain circumstances which include: (1) You have reason to believe your health would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). (2) You exhibit flu-like symptoms. (3) You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID-19 or influenza). (4) You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed. (5) You are pregnant, or you are 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation for high-risk individuals). (6) You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered; you are infirm; or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control, such as your ride did not show up). And (7) You have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY – JANUARY 18-25

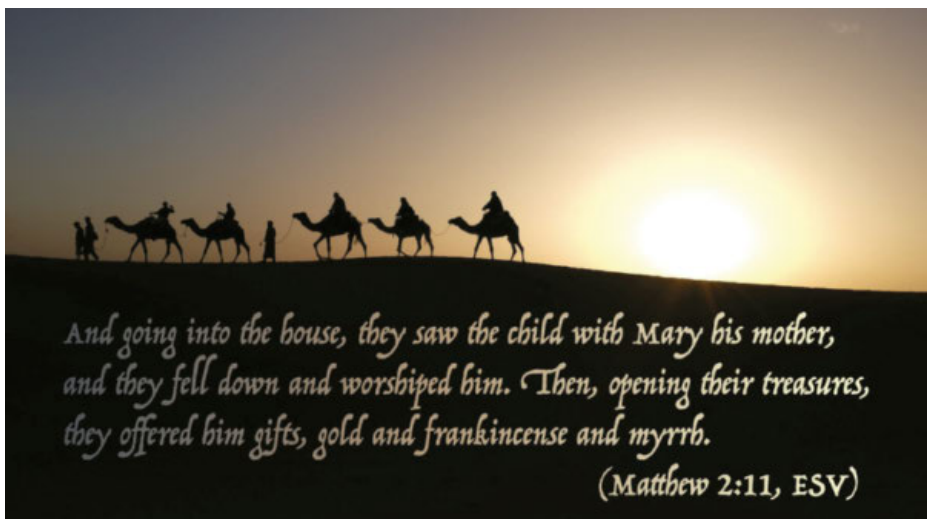
The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing this week of prayer, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (*John 17:21*).

The 2022 theme, "We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him." was selected by the Middle East Council of Churches and originates from the churches in Lebanon. Present times in Lebanon are extremely difficult and economically disastrous. All this combined with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have made the situation quite stressful. The power of prayer in solidarity with those who suffer is a demonstration of Christian unity and a sign of communion.

The theme, taken from the second chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew, is the Epiphany. Each year in January, the Church recalls the visit of the Magi to Bethlehem, highlighting God's invitation to all of humanity to a new covenant in the Incarnation of Christ. In the Eastern Churches, Epiphany is joined to the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, a baptism all Christians hold in common as testimony to their faith in the Son of God. Let us continue to pray for Christian unity in our world, that Jesus would draw all people toward Himself and one another.

We just finished the Christmas Season in the Liturgical Calendar. Now, we begin the Season of Ordinary Time which focuses on the life of Jesus. On the first day in Ordinary Time, we see in the Gospel of Mark that Jesus starts His ministry by claiming, “The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel.” (Mark 1:15) There is so much in this sentence that we could reflect on, but I want to focus on the word “repent,” or metanoia in the Greek, which means “change of mind, transformation of outlook, of man’s vision of the world and of himself, and a new way of loving others and God.” At the very beginning of Jesus’ ministry, He is asking us to change. What are we supposed to change? Well, I believe the simple answer is ourselves.

One of the ways we can do this is to recognize that we are sinners in need of God’s mercy. We receive this mercy in Reconciliation, one of the healing sacraments the Lord has given us. Sin blocks us from the graces God wants to bestow on us to help us change. We can see the order or importance the Lord places upon our spiritual well-being and having right relationship with God in the story of the paralytic man. (Lk 5:17-25) The first thing the Lord does after He saw the paralyzed man’s faith was to forgive his sins, and then He physically healed the man. Let’s follow the Lord’s lead and return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, so we can receive His grace to change.

EPISCOPAL ORDINATION OF THE MOST REVEREND JOSEPH A. WILLIAMS

Tuesday, January 25, 1 pm, Cathedral of Saint Paul, Saint Paul

On December 10, Pope Francis named Father Joseph Williams, a priest of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, as Auxiliary Bishop of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

The ordination of Joseph Williams to the Episcopacy will take place on the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, with a public reception to follow. If you plan to attend in-person, please remember that Archbishop Hebda has strongly encouraged mask-wearing at Mass, in light of the pandemic. The ordination will also be livestreamed on the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis’ Facebook page and aired on Metro Cable Channel 6.

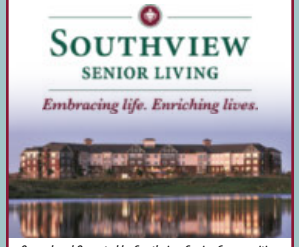
