TRANSFIGURATION

What makes a Catholic School Catholic? It isn't just crucifixes on the wall, as critically important as such signs are. It isn't just grace before meals and before class, though these moments of prayer are absolutely essential to forming the spiritual habits of our children. It certainly isn't just the presence of school uniforms, though the discipline and uniformity of such a policy does help with human formation.



As far as I am concerned, the Catholicity of a Catholic school depends on four principles –

1. The purpose of the human person is to know and love the Triune God, both in this life and in the next.
2. The sacramental life of the Church is the preeminent place of encounter with the Triune God this side of the veil.
3. The human person can know the truth, not only about material realities, but also about spiritual realities.
4. We are our brother's keeper.

The curriculum of a Catholic school must first and foremost be about the business of forming Christian disciples. Getting a good job and becoming a productive member of society is a wonderful and important thing, but it is absolutely not the most important piece of the proverbial puzzle when planning a Catholic School curriculum. The centerpiece must be a vision of why we exist and the purpose of our lives – to know and to love the Triune God.

Catholicism is a sacramental religion, that is, it teaches that God is made known and encountered in ritual and physical signs. Catholic school children should be formed in a sacramental imagination, so that they know the meanings of the signs and symbols of the Faith, but even more importantly, recognize the value of Sunday Mass, regular confession, and the dignity of baptism.

A Catholic school is a fundamentally positive and hopeful place, not only because it is rooted in an experience and pursuit of a God

Who is a loving Father, but also because it firmly believes that that Father God wants to be known, and that He reveals much of Himself in the beauty and order of the natural world,



the wonders of science and math, and the glories of art, literature and music. Due to our capacity to know this awesome and astounding truth, the created world is a place to explore, delight in, and inspire gratitude to the Creator. The Catholic school student must be taught never to fear inquiry and the pursuit of the truth, nor to believe the lie that natural truths are in contradiction to spiritual truths. The same God Who made the soul and the immaterial angels is the God Who fashioned the law of gravity into reality. Truth is symphonic, and is revealed in all its forms by a God Who is a loving Father.

Finally, no Catholic education is complete without clarity regarding our obligations to those around us. We are made to be in communion, and to share the love of God with all those whom we meet, but particularly with the poor and the weak. The Catholic school forms students in service, not because we want to make “do-gooders,” but because we know that to be a disciple demands that we follow the footsteps of the Master, the One Who came to serve and not to be served.


