Dear Friends,

Why do we at Transfiguration think that it is so important to bring Christ to all in the East Metro? Why not wait for them to come to us? If they want what we have, they will come to us, right? After all, religion is a private matter, and proselytizing is hardly the thing to do in this era of tolerance and diversity. Right?

Of course, it's not right! Jesus Christ is the Messiah of all people, and once we have met Him it is our duty, and our delight, to invite as many as we can into a relationship with Him. But Scripture is no place to look for assurances that all human beings will be saved, or that heaven is just a given for everyone. This simply isn't the Gospel, and Jesus speaks numerous times about the real danger of hell for those who die unrepentant, especially unrepentant of the sins of pride, judgment, avarice and apathy towards the poor. The Good Shepherd is no doting hippie. He has come to set the world on fire, and His first words are "Repent and believe!"

Far too often, the Catholic Faith is thought of as something like a health club – forgive me if you've heard this one. The comparison goes like this: We all recognize that exercise is important, and some decide to attend gyms or health clubs to achieve the best physical health they can. But they're not for everyone, and many enjoy staying physically fit without the burden of membership fees and the awkwardness of disappointed personal trainers. So too, or at least the comparison goes, with organized religion. You don't REALLY need religion or church to be good, but if it works for you, have at it!

But this isn't an accurate comparison at all. At least it's not Jesus' understanding...

*He said to them, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned."*  
 ~ Mark 16: 15,16

Now again, I want to state clearly that the Church, the authentic interpreter of Sacred Scripture, has definitively declared that salvation is possible for those who die without receiving the actual physical washing of sacramental baptism. God is not bound by His sacraments. But this should not cause us to neglect the many passages of Scripture, and writings of the saints and declarations of Councils, in which the profound need for the sacraments is conveyed and the Christian faith's essential connection to salvation is clearly communicated. The Catholic Church is much more than one option among many. It is the primary means by which Christ continues to be present on earth among His people, and the means through which He continues to save them.

So, what does this have to do with Transfiguration and our mission statement? It of course has everything to do with it, and hopefully will provide greater impetus for us all to be missionaries in the East Metro. Souls are at stake, without putting too fine a point on it.

But how to do it? How best to evangelize? It doesn't require much, I would suggest. Conversations with those you love about the importance of the Catholic Faith in your own life; promises of prayers to those who are suffering, and praying with them when you can; living differently than others through lives of service and joy and reconciliation; regular sacrifices offered up in love; being there for those who need you in a spirit of Christian charity. These are all ways to bring Christ to others.

Throughout this season of Lent, we'll be reflecting on different ways to better fulfill our missionary mandate. I hope these reflections will be helpful to you as you strive to make our parish's mission your own. Because it's not just about you; it's about all those who do not yet know Christ, and are in danger of never knowing Him Who alone can save them from their sins and eternal death.

This is our mission, our duty and our privilege – to bring all those in the East Metro to Christ, the Source and Summit of our daily and eternal lives.


