
These groups are filled with great men who will be a benefit not only to you, but to your family. You might even find friends to help you with weekend projects at your house. Our next session is **January 1.**


Ordering Your Priorities, an eight-lesson Bible study, is ideal if you...

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued from page 1)

There is no other One for whom to wait - He alone is the One sent to save. Without Him we are lost; with Him we will live forever.

In these particularly challenging times, it is my hope and prayer that Transfiguration continues to grow into a place of real refuge and real challenge. Refuge, because it is a place of joy, friendship, prayer and sacramental beauty; challenge, because the Lord has not come to merely comfort us. He has come to set us on fire for love of His Father and His people, particularly the poor and weak. And, frankly, to be set on fire is painful! But without His purifying love, and the changes He demands of us, we will die of cold – cold hearts, cold dreams, cold aspirations - with little life and doomed to die in our small mindedness and pettiness. Draw near to Him in the manger, the Eucharist and the poor. He will both console you and call you. He will transfigure you!

I believe the Lord is calling Transfiguration to be a place of profound community, where we look after each other, know each other, and both support and challenge each other in our walk with the Lord. There is just no way to live the Catholic Faith alone – it must be lived with others. Hence, we offer many opportunities to gather together. But we also must be a place of worship and sacrifice. Indeed, every Catholic parish exists primarily to celebrate the sacraments, preeminently the Holy Mass, the source and summit of the Christian Faith. And so we take the celebration of the sacraments seriously here, and attempt to celebrate them with dignity and devotion. What is more, the parish is a place of encounter with the Word of God, and so we seek to preach boldly and clearly the full teachings of our life-giving Catholic Faith. We are not ashamed of the Gospel.

If you are looking for a spiritual home, we hope you will consider Transfiguration. In addition, if you have grade-school aged children, I hope you will consider our parochial school, which features grade-levels pre-k through 8. We are building a culture of Christian Discipleship, Academic Excellence, and Great Love, and would love for you and your children to join us. And all at an affordable price!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

As we near the end of 2021, now is the time to consider a gift to our *Together in Gratitude*, *Forward in Hope* campaign. We are grateful for the support we have received so far but for us to reach our \$2.5 million goal to significantly reduce our debt, we need all families to participate. A gift in any amount will help us reach our goal.

What are the tax benefits to making a gift before the end of the year?

For parishioners who itemize deductions on their annual tax return, gifts made by December 31 can be claimed as a charitable tax deduction on your 2021 tax return.

What are some of the ways to make a year-end gift?

The most common way to give is a cash donation and is as simple as writing a check, authorizing a charge on your credit card or automatic withdrawal. A donor can total up their cash gifts to any qualifying organization for 2021 and claim a deduction for up to 50% of their adjusted gross income.

As of December 2015, a law was signed that make IRA charitable rollovers permanent. This charitable giving tool allows donors to contribute directly from their IRA. Some provisions include:

Individuals must be age 70 ½ or older to make a tax-free gift from their IRA.

The maximum amount an individual can contribute in a taxable year is \$100,000.

Charitable distributions must be made to a qualified charity like a parish, Catholic school or diocese.

The distributions must be made directly from the donor's IRA to the charity.

The distribution does not give the donor a charitable tax deduction, but it does lower the donor's adjust gross income and may save in ordinary income taxes.
