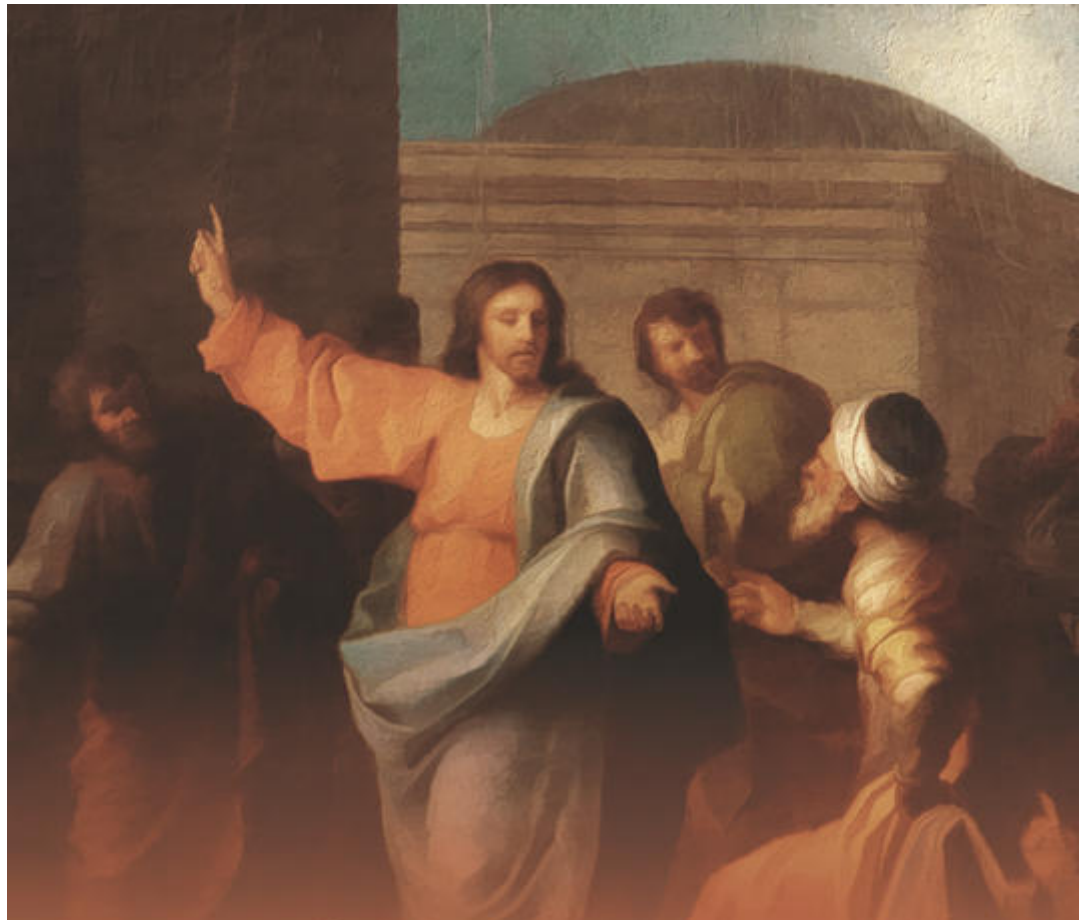

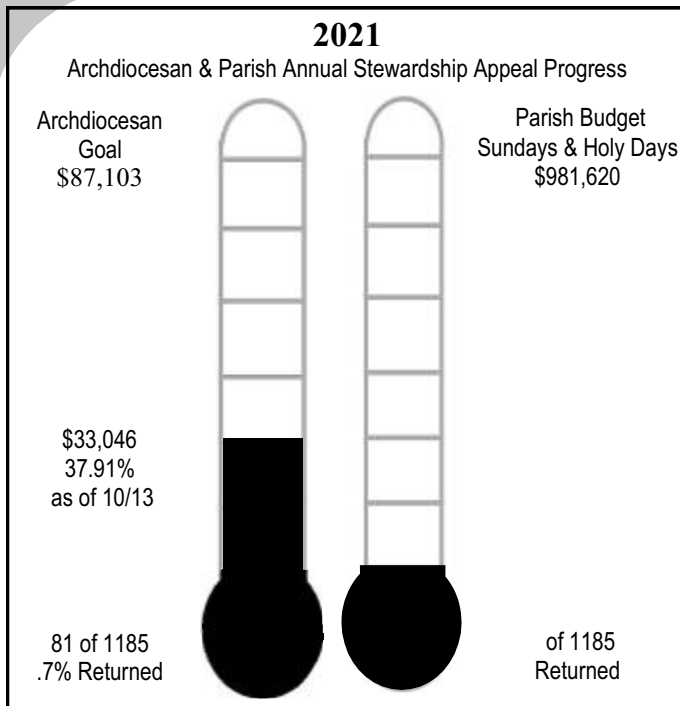

CARES Act

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton continues to move forward with its important work. In the midst of all that is going on, many of our parishioners are looking forward to the future when they can enjoy community with friends and resume their regular activities.

In response to the current situation, Congress enacted several tax law changes.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton has issued this information to offer resources to help you with your tax planning and to offer some ideas for you to consider if you are thinking about making a gift in support of our mission during this time.

This recently passed law includes several charitable tax provisions to encourage giving. These include:

- A new deduction for charitable donors who do not itemize when filing their tax returns. If you do not itemize but make a gift to charity, you will be allowed to take a special tax deduction, up to \$300, to reduce your tax liability.
- An increase in the deduction limit up to 100% of a donor's annual income for cash gifts (previously the deduction was capped at 60% of annual income). If you make a gift you will be able to deduct more this year.

FAITH FORMATION

Question of the Week for October 22-28

Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

Key Passage: “We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ...” (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3)

Question for Adults: If you were to write a thank you note to someone or to a group who has helped you grow in faith, to whom would you write and what would you say?

Question for Youth: We are supposed to give to God the things that are God’s. What in your life is dedicated to God? How do you keep those things sacred?

Question for Children: In your young life, who has helped you know Jesus as a friend?

Preferential Option for the Poor

“The Church’s love for the poor...is a part of her constant tradition.’ This love is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes, of the poverty of Jesus, and of His concern for the poor. Love for the poor is even one of the motives for the duty of working so as to ‘be able to give to those in need.’ It extends not only to material poverty but also to the many forms of cultural and religious poverty.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2444)

Prayer Before An Election

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city, state and country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community. We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty. We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender. We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom. We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your Word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow in the steps of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us to your Kingdom of justice and peace. We ask this in the name of your Son Jesus Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Faith Reflections

As a little boy, Carlo Acutis loved visiting the churches of Milan. His example helped his parents to return to the Church, and his mother to volunteer as a catechist in Religious Education. Carlo received First Communion at the age of seven and after that said the rosary and attended Mass daily. Because of his interest in computers, his parents bought him books on programming. Carlo taught himself to program and was good with animation and videos. He liked to play on his play station, but imposed limits on himself.

Carlo enjoyed attending a Jesuit-run school where he was known to be positive and funny. He seemed to know the right thing to say and when to say it, encouraging his friends to do the right thing. He and his mother collected food for the poor of Milan, and he rounded up his friends to help.

Carlo was confirmed when he was eleven years old. While helping with Religious Education at his parish. He noticed that children had a hard time with concepts when their parents didn’t take them to Mass. Carlo said, “The Eucharist is my highway to heaven. If people understood the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, their lives would be transformed. Carlo created a web-site about Eucharistic miracles. His work can still be seen at www.miracolieucaristici.org He said, “The more Eucharist we receive, the more we become like Christ so that on earth we have a foretaste of heaven.”

People often asked Carlo what he was going to be when he grew up. It was almost as if he had a premonition that he wouldn’t live long. Carlo said, “I want to be close to Jesus; that’s my life plan.” Carlo died at the age of fifteen on October 12, 2006 a week after being diagnosed with leukemia. He offered his suffering for the Church and Pope Benedict XVI, the pope at the time. He said, “Our aim has to be the infinite, not the finite. The infinite is our homeland, we have always been expected in heaven.”

On October 12, 2013, a young boy in Brazil was healed of a stomach condition through the intercession of Carlo Acutis. He and his mother were praying before his relics, and the boy knew right away that he was healed. Carlo Acutis was beautified in Assisi on October 10, 2020. Pope Francis has said of Carlo, “His witness shows today’s young people that true happiness is found by putting God first and serving Him in our brothers and sisters.” Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for us!

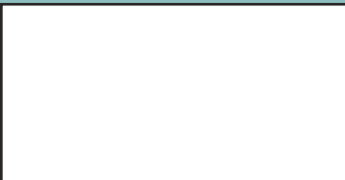

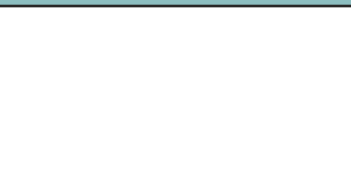
