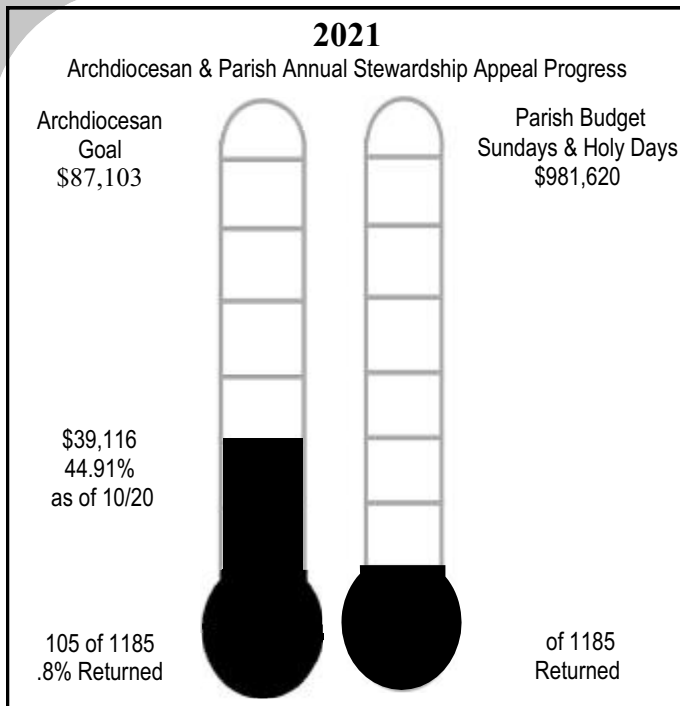

Construction was completed on October 24th.



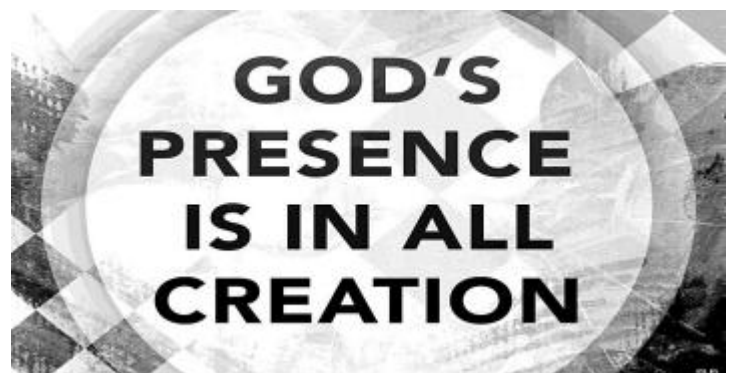
A dedication date has not been set.

Question of the Week for October 25-31

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Key Passage: Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-39)

Question for Adults: Repeat the commandments which Jesus teaches today in your own words? For each of them, share how it has become part of your life.

Question for Youth: Jesus tells us that we are to love others as we love ourselves. Do you love yourself? Can you see the good that God has put within you? Do you find it easier to love others or yourself?

Question for Children: We show our love for Jesus by loving our family and friends. Share one way that you show your love.

Preferential Option for the Poor

"If you lend money to one of your poor neighbors among my people, you shall not act like an extortioner toward him by demanding interest from him. If you take your neighbor's cloak as a pledge, you shall return it to him before sunset; for this cloak of his is the only covering he has for his body. What else has he to sleep in? If he cries out to me, I will hear him; for I am compassionate." (Exodus 22:24-26 – from the First Reading for this Sunday, October 25)

Faith Reflections

This Wednesday, October 28, we celebrate the Feast Day of Sts. Simon and Jude. We don't know much about these two apostles listed among the twelve in the Gospel of Luke. They have been linked together from the days of the early Church because they possibly suffered martyrdom together in Persia.

Many people ask the intercession of St. Jude known as the "patron saint of lost causes". It is said that few Christians invoked him for fear of praying to the Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus. The ignored St. Jude, the son of James was thought to be quite eager to assist anyone since he was rarely asked.

Every follower of Christ is called to make Him known. We consider the countless Christians across the centuries who have had this as their goal. Like Sts. Simon and Jude, we don't know all their stories but they have furthered the Church in its mission. May we join them, all point the way to Jesus by the manner of our lives.

O God, who by the blessed Apostles have brought us to acknowledge your name, graciously grant, through the intercession of Saints Simon and Jude, that the Church may constantly grow by increase of the peoples who believe in you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
