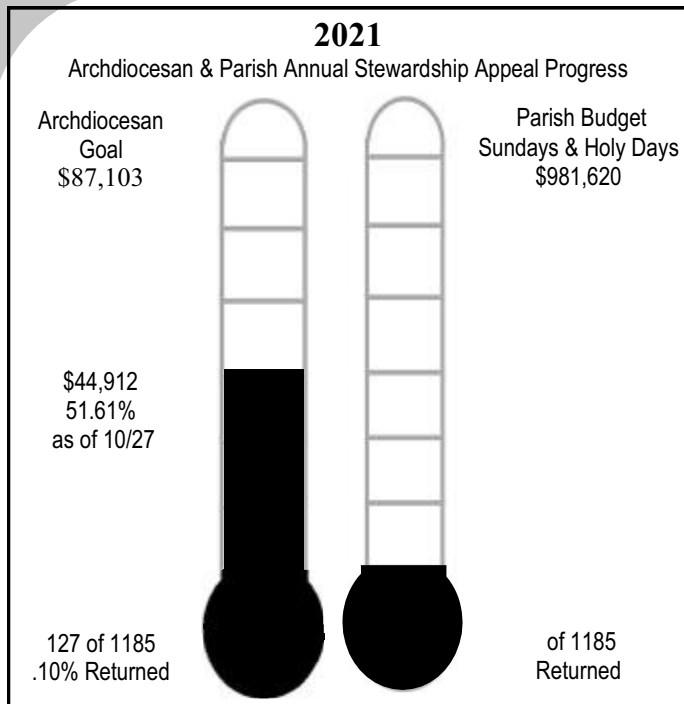

Question of the Week for November 1-7

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

Key Passage: “When Jesus saw the crowds, He went up the mountain, and after He had sat down, His disciples came to Him. He began to teach them saying: ‘Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.’” (Matthew 5:1-12a)

Question for Adults: When you heard the Beatitudes today, which one did you hear most clearly as a summons for your own life?

Question for Youth: All Saints Day gives us a chance to remember the saints of our Church and of our lives. Who are the people who have been saints in your life?

Question for Children: When have you become a peacemaker? Among your friends? In your family? At school? Other times?

Preferential Option for the Poor

“During the plague and famine of 1576, St. Charles Borromeo tried to feed 60,000 to 70,000 people daily. To do this he borrowed large sums of money that required years to repay. Whereas the civil authorities fled at the height of the plague, he stayed in Milan, where he ministered to the sick and the dying, helping those in want.” (Excerpt from Franciscan Media. Feast day for St. Charles Borromeo – November 4)

Prayer Before An Election

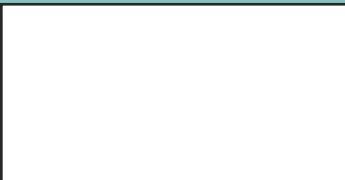

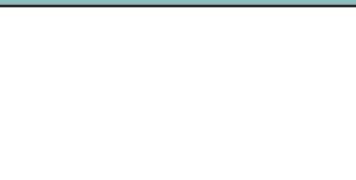
