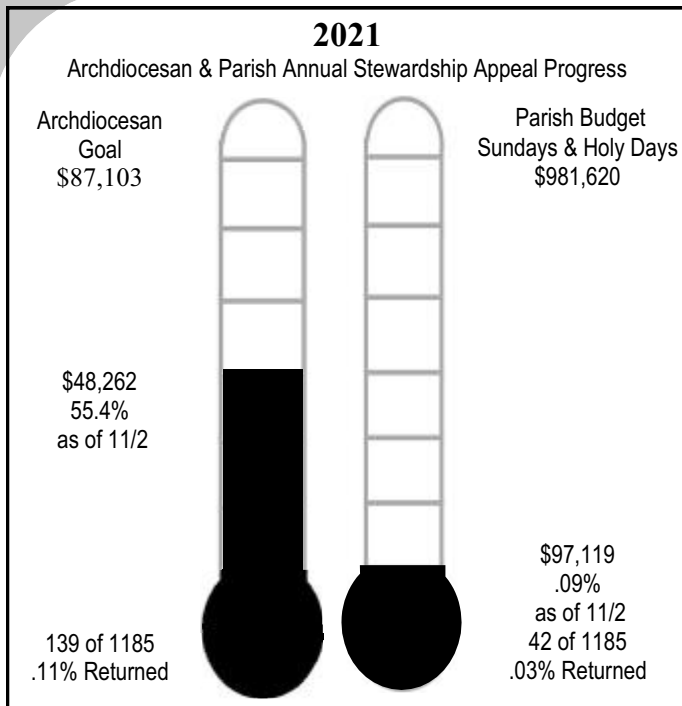

### Faith Reflections

One evening several years ago, I had trouble starting my car when it was time to go home. I knew the Knights of Columbus meeting at St. James would be ending soon. If I raised the hood of my car, some of them would come over to help. Sure enough, help came right away! God bless the members of the Knights of Columbus! On a grander scheme, you do so much good for our parishes and for the whole Church. Congratulations on the beatification of your founder, Fr. Michael McGivney!

Fr. McGivney lived from 1852-1890; he was the son of Irish immigrants with his parents settling in Connecticut. As a seminarian, he had to break from his studies to return home to help raise his younger siblings after their father died. From this experience, he recognized the devastating effect on immigrant families of the untimely death of the father and wage earner. These were the days of the policy, "Irish Need Not Apply". Immigrants often had to take the most dangerous positions in the mines, on the railroads, and in the factories.

On March 29, 1882, while serving as an assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with a small group of parishioners. It was to be a mutual aid society to provide financial assistance to widows and orphans. Fr. McGivney also wanted to make it easy for men to practice their Catholic faith. With the lure of anti-Catholic secret societies associated with certain trades, the Knights of Columbus was a fraternal society that supported men in their faith too. (Today the society has reached the two million member mark!)

Fr. McGivney died of pneumonia at the age of 38, also the victim of the pandemic in his time. On August 6, 2013, a miracle involving the healing of a baby in utero was attributed to his intercession. On May 27, 2020, this miracle was approved by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints and authorized by Pope Francis. On October 31, 2020, Fr. 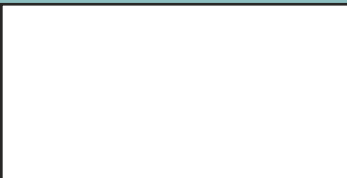

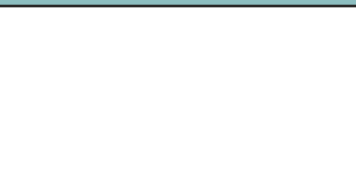
