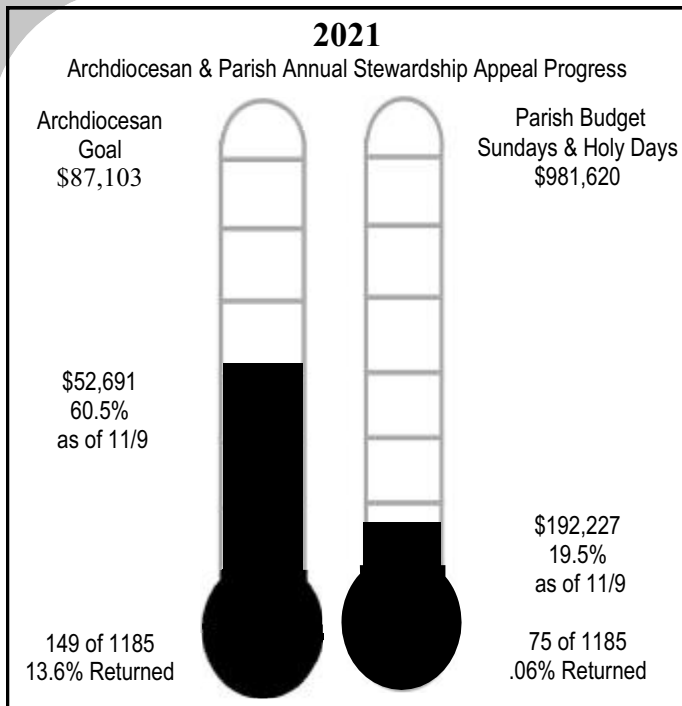

Faith Reflections

The Memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary is this Tuesday, November 17. I remember learning about this saint when I visited Hungary in 1987 with a group called the Friendship Force. This organization is still in existence today fostering relationships between people in different countries. My journey involved the first visit of participants to the homes of people living in a Communist country.

We visited Heroes Square in Budapest, the largest square in the city built to commemorate the thousand year history of Hungary in 1896. The square features a huge semicircular colonnade with fourteen statues of men whose lives had major impacts on Hungary’s history. It is centered by a 36-meter-tall column topped with a figure of Archangel Gabriel holding a crown for the nation’s founding king, St. Stephen of Hungary.

According to my journal, one of the kings represented in the colonnade was the father of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Our tour guide told us the story of St. Elizabeth carrying bread in her apron for the poor. Her royal husband pulled at her apron, and instead of bread, roses fell to ground. In truth, Elizabeth’s husband, Louis of Thuringia (southern Germany), was very supportive of her endeavors to help the poor.

Kings and queens, prime ministers and presidents belong to history, and are remembered from time to time. Our saints are remembered often, especially every year on their memorial or feast day. Their legacy goes beyond their country though. This week, I am remembering the saint I learned about on a warm, summer day in the beautiful city of Budapest. St. Elizabeth of Hungary, pray for your country, and pray for all of us.

For those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, we kindly ask you to receive at the end of the line during this time of COVID-19.

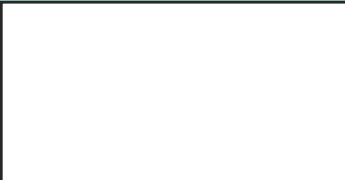

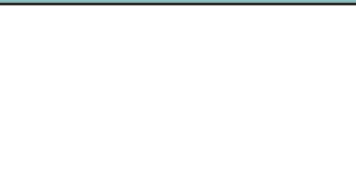
