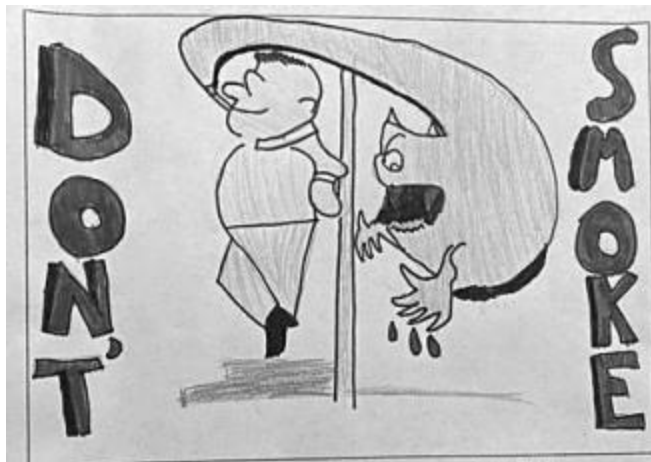
Full of Grace

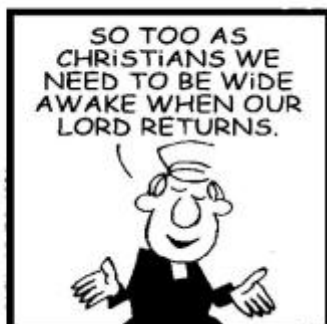

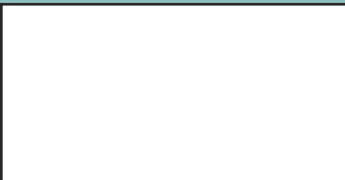

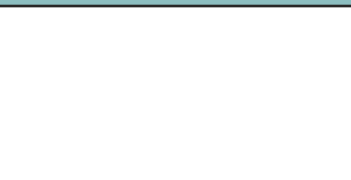
