

"Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not." EXODUS 16:4

When the Israelites gathered more than their daily portion of manna, the surplus became wormy and rotten. In the same way today, self-reliance, pride and ego leads to hoarding and excessive surplus of goods and money. Living a stewardship lifestyle helps us discern our "wants" from our "needs". Living a grateful and generous lifestyle reminds us that God will provide all that we need and that we have plenty to share.

Question of the Week for August 2-8

Gospel: John 6:24-35

Key Passage: “So they said to Jesus, ‘What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do?’” (John 6:30)

Faith Reflections

In today’s Gospel, the story continues after Jesus fed the five thousand. Jesus says to the people following Him, “For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.” (John 6:33) The people say in return: “Sir, give us this bread always.” (John 6:34)

We all have family members and friends who don’t attend Sunday Mass. Some only go to Mass on Christmas and Easter. Let us not grow weary of praying for them and showing them the joy that comes from living close to Jesus. In one of the workshops I attended years ago, the speaker asked us to receive communion remembering and praying for all those who weren’t with us – the homebound, the lapsed Catholic, those not married in the Catholic Church, those in other countries with mission priests who travel miles to be with their people, those in other countries who are persecuted for their faith... “Sir, give us this bread always.” (John 6:34)
