2021 GIVING TREE



In his childhood, a boy enjoyed playing with a tree, climbing, swinging from her branches, carving "Me + T (Tree)" into the bark, and eating her apples. However, as the boy grows older, he spends less time with the tree and tends to visit only when he wants. In an effort to make the boy happy at each of these stages, the tree gives parts of herself, which he can transform into material items, such as money (from apples), a house (from her branches), and a boat (from her trunk). With every stage of giving, "the Tree was happy".

Over the years of give and take when only a stump remains for the tree, she is not happy. The boy does return as a tired elderly man to meet the tree once more. She tells him she is sad, as she cannot provide him shade, apples, or any materials like in the past. He ignores this (because his teeth are too weak for apples, he is too old to swing on branches, and too tired to climb her trunk) and states that all he wants is a quiet place to sit and rest, which the tree, who is weak being just a stump, could provide. With this final stage of giving, "the Tree was happy".

This beautiful holiday is about Jesus, and the above story is so relatable to the natural relationship the Lord would have of us with the Siena Francis House. This is my "silver anniversary" (the silver lining to my Christmas holidays), the 25th year of Chairing The Giving Tree! I repeatedly and endlessly extend my deepest gratitude to all of the families and whose babies in car seats, now in high schools and beyond, STILL show up! To all who generously fulfill tags for presents, grocery gift cards, coats, donations, baked cookies, knitted wear, hygiene products, and so many various special gifts to happy faces at the Siena, The Holy Family church (St. Vincent de Paul), the needing families within our parish, every single gift that found their way to much needing hands, homes, and the homeless. To all who've shared and brought their loving spirit every year to the parties, spread the love with complete strangers who are our brothers and sisters in Christ, taken their sweatshirt off to give as a special gift to a recipient who didn't think he would ever own one, the singing and celebration of Jesus and the reason for the season. There have been so many undeniable blessings in this project. Rewardingly, the Siena has also been blessed to have changed with the times. Their facility has changed to accommodate apartment units, revamp their shelters and programs, and serve their purpose. At the same time, we took a turn and now have to make safe decisions around a pandemic and the Siena's facility changes. I am sorry to say we will not be able to host a Christmas party again this year. The Siena has offered to have conversations for the future, but much relies on the use of their facilities and impacted space. Like the tree stump, we will still stand strong for the Siena to lean on us, as the Siena continues to serve thousands in our community in need. We will still put up the Giving Tree, and we will prep and organize all of the donations and gifts to be dropped off at the Siena donation dock on Dec 18. Faith Reflections

There are so many wonderful Advent reflections. The passage below comes from the book, [The Passion of the Infant Christ](#) by Caryl Houselander, an ecclesiastical artist, mystic, religious writer and poet. She gives us much to ponder as we wait in hopeful anticipation for the coming of Christ!

“While Christ remained hidden in Mary, His rest was a tremendous activity; He was making her into Himself, making Himself from her. From her eyes, He was making the eyes that would weep over Jerusalem, that would shine upon the wildflowers, that would close in death and open in the morning of Resurrection. From her hands He was making the hands that would heal and raise the dead and be nailed to the cross. From her heart, He was making the heart whose love would redeem the world.

The same thing happens when, allowing the Infant Christ to rest in us, we wait patiently on His own timing of His growth in us, and give Him just what He asks, the extremely simple things that are ourselves – our hands and feet, our eyes and ears, our words, our thoughts, our love. Not only does He grow in us, but we are formed in Him.”
