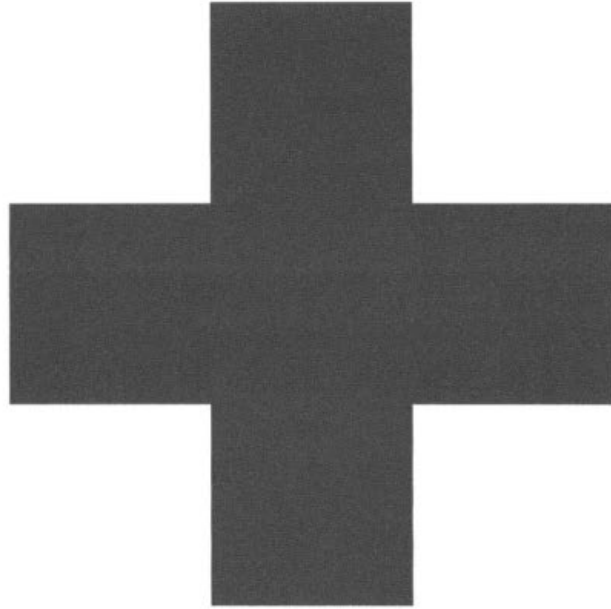

## Faith Reflections

There is an ancient custom of announcing the dates of Easter and the moveable feasts for the coming year on the Feast of the Epiphany. The Epiphany Proclamation below comes from the website of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops.

The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all set in relation to Easter.

Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany Proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the Resurrection of Jesus in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith that are celebrated each year. *Amidst Baby Jesus’ cries, can you hear Alleluia?* (Source – <https://www.usccb.org/>) Quote by unknown author

*Know, dear brothers and sisters,  
that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
so by leave of God's mercy  
we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.  
On the **second** day of **March** will fall Ash Wednesday,  
and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.  
On the **seventeenth** day of **April** you will celebrate with joy Easter Day,  
the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.  
In those places where the Ascension is observed on Thursday:  
On the **twenty-sixth** day of **May** will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.  
On the **fifth** day of **June**, the feast of Pentecost.  
On the **nineteenth** day of **June**, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.  
On the **twenty-seventh** day of **November**, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.*
