



Faith Reflections by Jo Kusek

This Sunday, we hear the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana. We teach this wonderful story to children preparing for First Communion. Jesus changed water into wine, and at the Last Supper, he will change wine into His own blood. The children are always surprised when Jesus says, "Woman, how does your concern affect me?" One little boy told me that he would get in trouble if he called his mother "Woman".

Thanks to the Bible Study on the Gospel of John by Dr. Edward Sri, I know that Jesus is acknowledging both His Mother's identity and His own with that question. Jesus is thinking of the woman in Genesis 3:15: *"I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike at your head, while you strike at his heel."* Someday there would be a son born of a woman who defeats the evil one. Jesus will crush the head of the serpent; He will defeat evil by his suffering, death and resurrection. Mary is the woman who bears the Savior and "the hour" of redemption begins now as Jesus works His first miracle.


