## From Fr. Ellis

### Happy Pentecost!



Today is the feast of Pentecost, when Jesus poured out the Holy Spirit on His disciples. It's considered the birthday of the Church! The Scriptures show us that it is only with the Holy Spirit that the disciples' ministry was effective. The same is true for us—we must rely on the Holy Spirit as we seek to draw near to Jesus through Mary.

### Mental Health Awareness Month, cont.

Last week, Anne Marie wrote about St. Dymphna, who is the patron saint of those with mental illness. Though I'm not sure I can match the quality of her article, I wanted to follow it up by pointing to someone in the Church today who has tried to set an example for facing mental illness. Bishop James Conley of the Diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska requested a leave of absence in late 2019 in order to seek healing and treatment for anxiety and depression. After almost a year of leave, he was able to return to ministry. He would not say that he is completely "cured," but that he has better support and tools for dealing with his mental illness. He has since shared some of his insights and experiences in an interview published through the University of Mary's website "Prime Matters." The full interview can be found here: [bit.ly/primematters](http://bit.ly/primematters). Here are some quotations from that discussion that I think really stand out:

*On balance:* "What this experience of mental illness has taught me is that life is too short to fill every day up from morning to night, even when we're filling the day up with good things. So, really, finding the right balance—a healthy balance—is an art."

*On why he resisted getting help:* "[My father] instilled in me and my sister this sort of can-do attitude about everything: "you can do whatever you want to do, pull yourself up by your bootstraps, if you're not doing it you're just not working hard enough."...that's the mentality I had when I was first trying to work through my struggles with mental illness: 'I can get through this, I can soldier through this.'"

*On the challenges and importance of prayer:* "Negative thoughts, anxiety, and depression can make it really difficult to pray...there were times where I would ask myself, 'Am I losing my mind, or am I losing my faith?'...When people are suffering the tendency is just not to pray, and that's dangerous, because when we do that we grow farther and farther away. I don't want people to feel guilty about struggling to pray, but we all need to do something. When we're suffering, it can be important to stick with things that are simple and familiar."
