From Fr. Ellis

Fr. Ellis away this week

Every two years, all the priests of the Archdiocese gather for a 4-day conference. This year is one of those years so I will be heading down to Winona this week. Because the vast majority of the priests in the greater Twin Cities area will be away, we will not be having daily Mass much of the week. I will be able to offer Mass Monday morning as usual, but there will not be Mass Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday. I will be back and able to offer Mass Friday morning.

Please hold all the priests in your prayers this week especially. Priests are human too, and like everyone, many of us have been challenged by the pandemic in ways that we hadn't faced before. It's providential, then, that we have this little break—and that the theme of this conference is priestly unity and brotherhood, presented by a psychologist who is a priest.

Fr. Jack moving out

For the last three years since his retirement, Fr. Jack Long has lived here in the OLP rectory. At the end of July, however, he will be moving to the Byrne Residence in St. Paul. The Byrne Residence is an apartment building for retired priests run by the Archdiocese, located on the campus of the University of St. Thomas near the St. Paul Seminary. Some of you have heard about his upcoming move already and are concerned that this is because of a change in Fr. Jack's health. This is not the case, as the Byrne Residence is not a nursing facility or assisted living. Rather, it will give him a chance to live with some of his classmates and peers who have also recently retired. He has always told me that his plan upon retirement was to live in a rectory for several years before moving to the Byrne Residence. Even though St. Paul sounds like a world away for Minneapolitans, he won't be much more than five miles from OLP. So I have a hunch that we will see him for events like Fish Fries and covering Mass from time to time.

Staff changes in the school

Many of you saw in the most recent issue of the OLP Quarterly that our Assistant Principal and Learning Specialist Megan Schuchman has moved to Florida. She held many different positions and roles over many years at OLP and will be missed. I am happy to announce that we have hired Meg Schneeman (yes, you're reading that right—their names are super similar!) for that position. She comes to us from Holy Spirit Catholic School in St. Paul, and her name is pronounced "schnay-man." Please welcome her to OLP!

Also, three teachers have moved on from our school. They are Ms. Klinker (3rd grade), Mrs. Martinmaki (4th grade), and Mr. Doyle (middle school language arts). The search process to fill all three positions is in progress; we will provide an update later once we fill them.

Saint Joseph: Patron Saint of Fathers and Father Figures

For many of us, the only time we think about St. Joseph is around Christmas, when we put out the nativity scene or hear the narratives of the birth of Jesus. We know the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus, was chosen by God to be His mother. However, Joseph was chosen as well- chosen to be the earthly father of Jesus. While Joseph is not the biological father of Jesus, he accepted the responsibility of being the father of Jesus.

In his Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an accepting father, a father who is "creatively courageous." Joseph defended, protected, cared for, and raised Jesus.

May all men look to St. Joseph and invoke his intercession, whether they are fathers or father figures. Pope Francis wrote:

"Fathers are not born, but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person."
