The U.S. Bishops and the Holy Eucharist

There has been a lot of coverage of the June meeting of the U.S. Bishops this year. Among many



other things, they discussed whether to admit certain Catholic politicians to Holy Communion, due to their public support for policies contrary to Catholic teaching. In the end, the bishops decided not to address this topic directly at the national level. At the same time, there are still plans for a document on the Holy Eucharist, as well as a multi-year initiative for Eucharistic Revival. This has lead some to speculate that the forthcoming document will end up being about this same issue anyway.

I know a lot of ink has been spilled about this already, but let me share a few of my thoughts and reactions to it, in hopes that it will be helpful.

First, discussions about who should be admitted to Holy Communion happen with some regularity at the diocesan and parish level. For example, pastors do find themselves at times explaining to those who are in a state of grave sin that they should not receive. These conversations always start privately, and a discussion of not admitting someone to Holy Communion would happen only if the situation was publicly and widely known. In part, the bishops' decision not to issue a statement may come from a respect for this process.

Secondly, I highly doubt that the bishops' continuing discussion and forthcoming document on the Holy Eucharist are a way to surreptitiously ban politicians from the sacrament. Several studies in recent years found that an alarmingly low percentage of Catholics believe that Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist. I imagine that this is the main motive for such a document. They want to inspire people with the beauty, centrality, and mystery of Christ's Real Presence. Still, it is likely that a section of the document will address in general terms who should not be admitted to Holy Communion. This is the teaching of the Church, and so it makes sense that any comprehensive discussion of the sacrament would include it. In addition, any time we talk about something amazing and inspiring, we also talk about the responsibilities we have to respect it. Take the United States flag, for instance. We can talk about all the liberty, bravery, and opportunity it symbolizes. But we also are taught the proper ways to fly it and fold it, to which we should adhere if we choose to display it. If this is true of a flag or other symbol, how much more the Holy Eucharist, which is Jesus Himself.
