From Fr. Ellis

Merry Christmas to you! This year, we celebrate Christmas on a Saturday, and then the very next day observe the feast of the Holy Family. Of course, these two holy days are closely related—in order



for there to be the Holy Family, Jesus had to be born into the household of St. Joseph and Mary. I think there is great wisdom in having these two celebrations follow one another in quick succession every year, whether or not they are on consecutive days. Christmas obviously and appropriately centers on Jesus. That is not to say that Mary and Joseph are not part of the whole nativity scene, but the emphasis is on the fact that God took on human flesh and was born as an infant here on earth. This truth, called the Incarnation, is a central mystery and a core tenet of our faith. Without taking the least thing away from that, the feast of the Holy Family focuses on relationship. Jesus didn't come to be an individualistic superhero, a lone-ranger type. He came to heal and to save, and to do so in the context of relationships. This is consistent with the way God has interacted with us since the beginning; He has always called not just individuals, but families—a whole people—to follow Him.

This means that our own families are the place where God wants to work His saving power. In other words, Jesus wants to make our households holy families too. Even in secular conversations, we sometimes hear people speak of their bodies as a temple. We believe this to be true; at baptism, God comes and dwells in our souls. At the same time, temples have always been rather solitary places. A god or gods lives in a temple as their house, and from time to time a priest or two comes to offer worship or sacrifice. By contrast, a church is a place where a group of people come together to pray and worship. It is still the house of God, but it is where His family gathers. This is what our families are meant to be as well. Yes, we are all temples of the Holy Spirit, but in addition the members of a family are called to follow Jesus and worship him together. For this reason, the Church sometimes refers to the family as the domestic church. Just as much as a parish church, it exists to support its members on the path to Heaven by following Jesus here on earth. Despite the fact that no family is perfect, I invite you to view your families in this light. It helps us see that family prayers and acts of charity are not just items on a list of tasks, but a continuation of the saving work that Jesus came to bring about.


