Episcopal Trivia

With the ordination of Bishop-elect Joseph Williams this Tuesday (1 pm at the Cathedral!) I thought it would be



fun to pull together some trivia about bishops. Here are some little tidbits, in no particular order:

- · Episcopal is the adjective form of the noun bishop
- Each bishop is given a diocese. An archdiocese (led by an archbishop) is in most ways the same as a diocese, but the archbishop coordinates the bishops in the surrounding dioceses.
- ·What about bishops that don't have their own diocese? Bishops that work for Vatican offices and auxiliary bishops are a couple of examples. They are given a *titular* diocese. These are dioceses that used to exist but were suppressed due to changing needs. So, for example, Bishop Williams will be the titular bishop of Idassa which, as near as I can tell, was a town in what is now northeast Algeria.
- Bishops choose a motto for their ministry, as well as a coat of arms. I haven't been able to find what those are for Bishop Williams as of this writing.
- We believe there is an unbroken line of succession from every bishop back to one of the apostles, even if we can't trace it with historical records. The website catholic-hierarchy.org tracks Bishop Williams' succession back to the mid-1500s.
- To ensure this succession is unbroken, when a bishop is ordained (also referred to as *consecration*) there is always a bishop who serves as principal consecrator and two others who serve as co-consecrators.
- •The distinctive color for a bishop's garb is fuchsia.
- · His cassock (a button-down garment reaching down to his shoes) may be black and piped with fuchsia or be completely fuchsia.
- •Over his cassock, the bishop often wears a fuchsia fascia (say that 10 times fast!), which is a sash around his waist.
- ·You might see a bishop wear a short matching shoulder cape over his cassock. This is called a mozzetta or simar. (This was something new I learned compiling this list!)
- •The bishop's small fuchsia hat is called a *zucchetto*, while the tall pointy hat worn at Mass is a *miter*.
- Bishops have a *crosier* (shepherd's staff), a ring, and a pectoral cross that is worn around their neck, and sometimes placed in their shirt pocket near their heart.
- · When addressing a bishop in formal conversation, the appropriate title is "Your Excellency." In writing, the bishop's title is "Most Reverend Joseph Williams," for example.
