



Fr. Tom'sThoughts

Dear St. James Parishioners,

I sure hope your Ash Wednesday went well this past week. It is important for us to be constantly reminded that we are dust and, someday, we will

return to dust. It is sobering to contemplate the reality of the short time we have here on earth and the eternal consequences we will face by our earthly decisions. Yes, there is a judgment ahead and we want to be always ready to face Him, Jesus, our just judge.

That is why we journey into the desert with Jesus every Lent. This Sunday we hear about his temptation in the desert. Lent is a time to face our weaknesses, temptations, and failures and consciously attempt to overcome them. That is why we give things up (TV, video games, chocolate, alcohol, smoking, gossiping, arguing etc.) or do something extra (participate in *Live Lent Together*, visit someone in the hospital or nursing home, make a donation such as to Catholic Relief Services "Rice Bowl" collection or to our parish) or make plans to come to Confession, our Parish Mission or the events of Holy Week. These are all great sources of grace which can help us grow in our faith and overcome our obstacles to holiness.

This year we also handed out the book *Everybody Needs to Forgive Somebody* on Ash Wednesday and we invited every family to take one home. It is absolutely true that we all need to forgive somebody. We all have been hurt in our relationships and some of these hurts have been very deep. But then think of everything from God's perspective: He made us out of love and calls us to love. He so easily forgives us but He also calls us to do the same. He sent Jesus into the world to show us the way to salvation and to open the door to Heaven for us by His death and resurrection. Our Lenten journey is an opportunity for us to join Him on the path to Heaven.

We can do this in many ways, but a particularly excellent way is by our forgiving others and for us to ask others for the forgiveness we need. The Gospel calls us to be ambassadors of reconciliation. It is not an easy mission as people can hurt us so badly. But that doesn't stop Him for calling us to do so. Think of Him dying on the cross so horribly and yet He was willing to forgive them. How could He do that? He knows it does no good to cling to hurts from the past.

Thank goodness He will forgive us, also, if we approach Him in the confessional. He is willing to forgive everybody if we only will ask Him for forgiveness. What is holding us back? Can we even forgive ourselves for the stupid mistakes we've made in our past. This Lent let's make it a goal to forgive – ourselves and others and to ask forgiveness from others and from Jesus for ourselves. It is so incredibly freeing to let it go and find true peace in our relationships.

Welcome to Lent and have a great journey into the desert! God bless everyone!



Faith Reflections

Our hearts and our prayers go out to the people of the Ukraine fighting for their freedom and way of life. On the Sunday after the war began, the NBC Nightly News showed scenes of prayer from many Ukrainian Orthodox and Ukrainian Catholic Churches here in the United States. Timothy Cardinal Dolan of New York visited St. George Ukrainian Catholic Church in Manhattan.

When I was a teacher in south Omaha, we often took our junior high students to Assumption Byzantine Catholic Church on 16th and Martha. It was an opportunity for them to experience another culture and to see how the Divine Liturgy is prayed. The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom is prayed in the same way by the Byzantine Catholic and Orthodox Churches. Because this church in Omaha is in communion with Rome, we could also receive Holy Communion.

In 2002, Fr. Bill MacKinnon welcomed the students warmly after the Divine Liturgy and he stayed to answer their many questions. Fr. Bill wasn't Ukrainian but he had joined the church when he married his wife. After working as a detective in Brooklyn and in law enforcement in Missouri, he was ordained a priest at the age of 64. He said that he had seen a lot of terrible things in his work, but at the end of his life, God called him to be a priest. He told the students to be ready for the unexpected, and that God would be with them. Fr. Bill passed from cancer in 2004. I only met him once, but I consider him one of my favorite priests.

Years after that experience, I remember the cool temperature of the church, the light streaming in the stained glass windows as we faced the east, and how Fr. Bill seemed to grow taller as he prayed the prayer to the Holy Spirit listed below. I have been praying it for the people of Ukraine. I invite readers of this article to pray it too.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

O Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, Who are everywhere present and fill all things. Treasury of Blessings and Giver of Life, come to us, Dwell with us and fill us with all good things, And save our souls, O Gracious God.




