

Fr. Tom'sThoughts

Dear St. James Parishioners,

Wouldn't it be cool to see a miracle like the Transformation? I know I would love to see it. That would be a real booster shot to my faith (and,

hopefully, everybody's). It was to the apostles'! If God could do that – doesn't that mean He exists? And if He exists – doesn't that mean that He made us for a purpose? And if we have a purpose – doesn't that mean we're responsible for fulfilling our purpose and are going to be judged some day? And if we're going to be judged – doesn't that mean we could fail and go to Hell (or succeed and go to Heaven)?

<u>YES!!!</u>

That is why our faith is so important! It puts life in perspective and helps us aim for (and get to) our eternal reward in Heaven. It also helps us get the best and biggest reward. Jesus came so we could have life in abundance – here - and hereafter! Wow!

And that is why we go into the desert of Lent every year - to check our progress and to make the necessary changes. Last week we saw Jesus tempted by Satan at the beginning of His ministry. This week we see Jesus taking Peter, James (our James!), and John up a high mountain and giving them a very clear sign of who He is - towards the end of his ministry. The Father concludes this miracle of the Transfiguration with the very clear statement, "This is My chosen Son; *LISTEN TO HIM!*"

Yes, Sir!!! I'm listening to Him and I hope I can hear Him ever more clearly and follow Him more closely every day of my life. And I apologize for any failures of mine to listen to Him. That is another reason why we want to conclude our journey of Lent by making plans to go to Confession before Easter. We all fall short of who God wants us to be and are not always listening to His divine Son well. We will be publishing our individual Confession times here in a couple of weeks. Our Parish Reconciliation Service is scheduled for Tuesday, April 12th and St. Elizabeth Ann's is the day before on Monday, April 11th.

I must admit that I had my own Transfiguration experience by going to Medjugorje. I have not actually seen Our Blessed Mother, but it was through her apparitions to the 6 children there that it really became clear to me that our faith is extremely important. And I needed to respond better to the Lord's call. That was the key element in my becoming a priest almost 26 years ago. Today, I am actually going on another pilgrimage to Medjugorje and hope to return on March 22nd. We have a nice group going and I always feel my faith is strengthened by going back there. Although, the Church has not yet approved the apparitions there, She has also not condemned them. And the Pope has approved pilgrimages going there.

We ask the Lord to strengthen everybody's faith this Lent! He might use a miracle, or He might just quietly call us. Let's keep *listening* to Him! God bless everyone!



your commitment to having masses said for a whole variety of intentions. However, one of the issues we have run into in recent months is that we have had to turn parishioners away who wished to have Masses said promptly, particularly for the recently deceased. Thus, to better serve all our parishioners, we have enacted some new policies regarding Mass intentions, which are outlined below:

1) Mass intentions will be limited to six (6) per year per household. Of those six (6) intentions, two (2) may be for Sunday or holiday Masses, while four (four) must be used for weekday Masses. All Holidays count as Sundays even if they occur on other days of the week.

2) A household may only select one Mass per year on any of the following holidays: Christmas, Easter, Mothers' Day, Fathers' Day, and Thanksgiving. Additionally, a household may not select the same Mass two (2) years in a row on the same holiday.

3) There is a maximum of one (1) intention per month for any individual person or group of people.

4) The standard stipend according to Archdiocesan policies is at least \$10 per Mass intention.

5) Masses may be scheduled up to one (1) calendar year in advance.




