

Consider this letter a personal invitation to join us for our Parish Lenten Mission the evening of March 20th, 21st, and 22nd! Why might you want to join us? Well, firstly, its an easy way to enter into the Lenten practice of prayer, to deepen our relationship with the Lord. Jesus wishes to know you specifically, your heart, your joys, your sorrows, and everything in between. Like any friendship though, we only come to know Him by spending time with Him, and we call that time "prayer." Secondly, when it comes to prayer, our presenter for our mission comes from a religious community with a long and famous connection to this most fundamental of Christian practices.
