

Hello St. James!

This weekend we celebrate the joyous occasion of First Communion, where the second graders from St. James Seton, as well as from our

PRE Program, will join the rest of our parish community in the reception of the Holy Eucharist for the very first time. In doing so, they enter fully into the sacrament of the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus, instituted by the Lord Himself at the Last Super, which we will commemorate in just a few short weeks at Holy Thursday. Like many of the Sacraments, First Communion is indeed a beautiful first, but is also just the beginning. Every baptized Catholic who has received their First Communion also has the incredible opportunity, each day, and at the very least each Sunday, to enter into this magnificent font of grace once again. Do join me in offering a prayer of thanksgiving for our First Communicants, and on their behalf, as they take this important step on their journey of faith.

Speaking of sacraments, on the page opposite this letter, you will see a schedule of special Confession times during the Lenten season, as well as our schedule for the special liturgies during Holy Week. Fr. Tom and I know that, sometimes, Saturday afternoon just doesn't work to come to Confession, so we have put together a whole plethora of times! Hopefully, one of them works for you! We go to Confession because God has chosen to express His forgiving love through this particular sacrament in this particular way.

As human beings, God knows that one of our needs is to be certain, to be re-assured. He wants us to know with certainty that when we are sincerely repentant, when we are truly sorry, that He has forgiven our sins. Recall that, again and again in the Gospels, Jesus showed His love through outward, external signs. Thus, Confession follows in that Tradition of external signs of our inward repentance. The Church also teaches that the priest ministers *in persona Christi*, in the person of Christ. This is both an amazing reality and a glorious mystery. In Confession, the words spoken by the priest, "I absolve you from your sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," are spoken as Christ Himself, for it is always from Him that we receive mercy, forgiveness, and strength to "go forth and sin no more."

Know of my prayers as we continue our journey together through Lent, the Lord is never outdone in generosity, especially in these special days!




Pray the Rosary







