Fr. Tom'sThoughts

Dear St. James Parishioners,

Three things this week:

1) Well, we made it back safely from **Medjugorje** on March 22nd. We had a great pilgrimage and did not have any problems or concerns with the Ukrainian War. We also made it through Germany, which was having an airport worker strike. Fortunately, we went through Munich which was the only airport not affected by the strike. God is so good and our Lady was definitely with us.

Highlights of the pilgrimage included: we were able to be present with the visionary Marija when she had her daily apparition; we were nearby when the visionary Mirjana had her yearly apparition on March 18th; we climbed both Apparition Hill and Cross Mountain; Fr. Petar Ljubicic (the priest chosen to reveal the secrets when the time comes) came to our hotel and gave us a wonderful talk; I was the celebrant for the English pilgrim Mass on March 18th; we visited the Cenacolo Community and had a couple of men give witness to their rehabilitation from drug addiction: as well as the daily Masses, prayers, adorations and other experiences.

It is always a remarkable experience and it was again this time. Medjugorje is considered the Confessional of the World and I find it always heart-warming to hear some profound confessions. There were also a lot of other pilgrims present and it was fun visiting with them as they had some remarkable stories to tell. As we ended our pilgrimage, we shared graces we had received and it was amazing how each individual was affected. There is never a dull moment while we're there; the time goes too fast and it's so hard to leave.

- 2) We did leave and now I'm back at St. James and we go forward toward Holy Week and Easter. You'll notice on page 2 the **Confession and Mass schedules** for the weeks ahead. It's a busy, but sacred time, as we contemplate the events of our salvation. How could God love us so much that He would give us His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life? Please come to confession and join our celebrations!
- 3) By the way, I am also going on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in mid October this year (the dates are not finalized as yet). There are flyers in the kiosk in the narthex. We will also have a question and answer session on Wednesday, April 27th in the Parish Center at 7pm. If you have any interest, please come to this session or give me a call at the rectory. The Holy Land is a remarkable place to visit as that is where Jesus and Mary lived and we can get into the feeling of what they experienced in this life.

Preferential Option for the Poor

"There are three types of destitution: material, moral and spiritual." Material destitution is what is normally called poverty, and affects those living in conditions opposed to human dignity: those who lack basic rights and needs such as food, water, hygiene, work and the opportunity to develop and grow culturally. In response to this destitution, the Church offers her help, her diakonia, in meeting these needs and binding these wounds which disfigure the face of humanity. In the poor and outcast we see Christ's face; by loving and helping the poor, we love and serve Christ. Our efforts are also directed to ending violations of human dignity, discrimination and abuse in the world, for these are so often the cause of destitution. When power, luxury and money become idols, they take priority over the need for a fair distribution of wealth. Our consciences thus need to be converted to justice, equality, simplicity and sharing." (From the Lenten Message of Pope Francis in 2014)

Faith Reflections

When I made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2013, I learned that the area known as the Temple Mount in Jerusalem is significant to Jews, Christians and Muslims. According to Jewish tradition, it was here that God bent down to form Adam from the dust of the earth, and where Abraham was going to sacrifice his son, Isaac. The name Temple Mount comes from the two Temples who once stood there too, one built by King Solomon around 1000 B.C. and the other in the first century B.C. when Babylonian captives returned from exile.

In today's Gospel, we find Jesus in the temple area when the scribes and Pharisees bring Him the woman caught in adultery. Through the ages, we have wondered what Jesus was writing when He bent down and began writing on the ground with His finger. Here in the place where God once formed Adam, Jesus, the God-man is once more working with dust. Jesus wants to renew us all, to recreate us by His grace and bring us all salvation.

"Jesus wrote on the ground, in the dust of which every human being is made, God's sentence: "I do not desire that you die, but that you live." God does not nail us to our sins. He does not identify us with the evil we have done. We have a name, and God does not identify this name with the sin we have committed. He desires to liberate us, and He wants us to want this together with Him. He wants our freedom to be converted from evil to good, and this is possible — it is possible! — with His grace." (Excerpt from the Homily of Pope Francis on 3/13/16)

St. Giuseppe Moscati: Doctor to the

Giuseppe Moscati, "the holy physician of Naples," as a medical doctor and layman in the early twentieth century who came from an aristocratic family and devoted

his medical career to serving the poor. He was also a medical school professor and a pioneer in the field of biochemistry whose research led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes. Giuseppe Moscati died in 1927 at forty-six years old, was beatified in 1975, and declared a saint by Pope John Paul II in 1987. His feast day is November 16.






