

Fr. Zach's Muzings

Hello St. James!

This weekend we celebrate Palm Sunday, an ancient celebration of the Church that always occurs on the Sunday preceding Easter,

signaling the beginning of Holy Week and the high holy days of the year. You are probably familiar with the Gospel accounts of Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey as people laid their cloaks and branches down before Him proclaiming, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" (Matthew 21:9). It is precisely this scene that the early Christians, upon the legalization of freedom of worship within the Roman Empire by Constantine in 313 AD, reenacted on that first Sunday before Easter, processing down the Mount of Olives carrying olive branches in their hands and singing Hosanna as they entered the Holy City.

Now, obviously, olive trees are quite different from palm trees, so where do the palms come from? This particular tradition appears to have originated in the Frankish Kingdom, which encompassed much of France, northern Spain, and northern Italy, and references to the specifics of the Palm Sunday liturgy can be found in monastery writings as early as the 8th century. This liturgy eventually came to, and was approved by, Rome, and it is from the Roman liturgical prayers that the prayers we say this weekend are taken. In those days, palms would be blessed during a Mass celebrated outside the Roman walls, and then taken in procession to St. Peter's (or before its construction, St. John Lateran), where a second Mass would be celebrated. Now, it takes place within a single Mass, yet the structure of the blessing of the palms themselves can be seen to mirror the Mass still.

If you were to travel around the world on this particular Sunday, you would note that different types of plants are used in different places. The name of this Sunday is also different depending on where you are. Here in the United States, universally, palms are used, and it is "Palm Sunday". In parts of England, willow branches are used, and it is "Willow Sunday". In Spain and Portugal, a whole variety of plant branches are used, leading to the name Domingo de Ramos meaning Branch Sunday in both Spanish and Portuguese.

Regardless of how one celebrates this day, we all commemorate together Christ's entry into Jerusalem, and mark the beginning of Holy Week. As we enter into these holiest of days, we unite our prayers with the Church throughout the world, that we each may encounter Jesus in a new and personal way as we walk alongside Him from the Last Supper to the Cross to the empty tomb.



Faith Reflections

Since 1980, Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa, OFM CAP has been the preacher to the papal household. Once every year, the world gets to hear him preach. Instead of the reigning pope, Fr. Cantalamessa offers the homily for the Liturgy of Good Friday in St. Peter's Basilica. I would recommend watching Good Friday services from Rome on EWTN. It is usually shown twice – once in real time, and then as an encore. (Check www.ewtn.com for the Holy Week schedule)

One year Fr. Cantalamessa used the words of Pontius Pilate, "Behold the man!" or more dramatically in Latin, "Ecce Homo". Every time Christ's mystical body suffers in the world, let us proclaim "Ecce Homo", "Behold the man", "Behold Christ".

Philosopher Blaise Pascal wrote, "Christ will be in agony until the end of the world; we must not sleep during this time." Let us not be indifferent to the suffering of Christ in the world......refugees, victims of war, victims of abortion, victims of crime, those persecuted for their faith, the poor, the imprisoned, the unemployed, the sick, the elderly, the ones who are alone in any way.

Year ago, I met a woman who was very much an advocate of Liberation Theology. She told me about a movie with two men who were unjustly imprisoned in a Central American country. From their single jail cells, they could see look out and see executions. As one of the men was about to die, his friend called out, "I see you! I see you!"

How important it is to see the injustices of the world and not to leave our brothers and sisters alone. On the day of the greatest injustice the world has ever or will ever know, Blessed Mother Mary was below the cross of her Son. Scripture does not record it, but what were her words? Perhaps she also cried out in sorrow and compassion, "I see you! I see you! You are not alone!"
