

# Faith Reflections

Easter is a movable feast. It falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. This year the spring equinox was March 20, and the first full moon afterwards was on April 16. Today is April 17<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday after the full moon. Happy Easter!

From the time of the early Church, Christians have made pilgrimages to the Holy Land for Easter. In the time of the early Church, most people traveled on foot walking at night by the light of the moon. A week after the full moon would have the moon rising late at night and being in the sky all night, very convenient for those traveling.

This Easter, let us remember all the new Catholics who have chosen to "pilgrimage" with us on our way to heaven. Last night at the Easter Vigils celebrated throughout the world, thousands of people were received into the Catholic Church through the sacraments.

Let us remember the people of the Holy Land and the surrounding countries of the Middle East, that the light of peace might come to stay with them. Let us remember the displaced people of Ukraine and their journeys to places unknown and unplanned. The same moon shines upon them this Easter if they travel by night. May Jesus, "the one Morning Star who never sets.....coming back from death's domain, shed His peaceful light on humanity" for He ...."lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen." (Quote from the Exsultet, the Easter Proclamation)


