Hello St. James!

Easter greetings to each of you! It is eminently appropriate that, following our celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus this past Sunday, this Sunday we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. It is, in fact, His great mercy and love for us that caused Him to willingly go to the cross for you and me, to repay a debt that we could not hope to pay, and thus to reopen to us the gates of Heaven!

So, why do we celebrate this feast? In His appearances to St. Faustina, the Lord made clear His desire to reach out to souls in need of His mercy and forgiveness. In her diary, the Saint recorded the words of Jesus thus, "the Feast of My Mercy has issued forth from My very depths for the consolation of the whole world." Jesus is throwing a lifeline to each of us, struggling to follow Him in this broken world, a lifeline of mercy, love and grace.

Who is the feast intended for? Jesus tells St. Faustina, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls." This feast is meant for all of us. We are all sinners, for whether in great or small ways in our lives, we often fail to follow the commands the Lord has given us. Thus, in His mercy, the Lord invites us to return to Him, once again, through the celebration of this feast. He is reaching out to us, the lost, that we may be found, to us who struggle, that we may be strengthened to carry on!

You are welcome to join us this Sunday afternoon from 3:00pm to 4:00 pm for a special hour of prayer. We will have Confessions with multiple priests available, along with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and some video instruction on devotion to Divine Mercy and the life of St. Faustina. See you then, and continued Easter blessings to you all!





Gospel Question of the Week Gospel: John 20:19-31

Key Passage: "Then Jesus said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.'" (John 20:27)

Question for Adults: Jesus said: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." Give one example of how you will show your belief in Jesus this week, and how you are being sent forth as a witness to the Resurrection.

Question for Youth: Thomas didn't believe because he hadn't seen Jesus with his own eyes. How hard is it for you to believe in God without being able to see God? How do you see God in the words and actions of others?

Question for Children: Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they were afraid and locked in the closed room. How can you show Jesus to another person this week by how you act?

Faith Reflections

This Sunday, our Orthodox brothers and sisters are celebrating Easter, and we are celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday. Wouldn't it be wonderful if the war in Ukraine could end today! Let us continue to pray for peace there and throughout the world. Today, Orthodox Christians greet each other with the words, "Christ is risen" and the response, "He is risen indeed." I imagine this greeting taking place even in the midst of war and hardship. St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "Never let anything so fill you with sorrow as to make you forget the joy of Christ risen." May God bless those in the midst of suffering with an increase of faith, hope and love.

St. John Paul II said that the Church must "breathe with both lungs – west and east". It's good to follow his appreciation of the Eastern Church. On the website of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in the United States, I found this beautiful Easter prayer to Mary. It will remind many of our Regina Caeli prayer that is said in place of the Angelus during the Easter season. We ask Mary's intercession for peace too.

The Angel cried to the Lady, full of grace: Rejoice, O pure Virgin! Again, I say: Rejoice, your Son is risen from His three days in the tomb! With Himself He has raised all the dead. Rejoice, O ye people! Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem! The glory of the Lord has shone on you. Exult now, and be glad, O Zion! Be radiant, O pure Theotokos, in the Resurrection of your Son!






