The Door of Worship

Worship, through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, is the source and summit of our Christian faith. By attending Mass each weekend, we gather as a community of faith—not out of mere obligation but out of love for Jesus. Commit to give back in gratitude to God a portion of the financial gifts He has given to us. St. James encourages tithing, which involves returning the first 10% of gross income to the Lord—5% to the parish, 1% to the archdiocese and 4% to other charities. The Door of Spiritual Growth

Our faith journey begins with an encounter with Jesus Christ and is constantly in motion. Our ability to open this door helps determine whether we are moving closer to God or falling away from Him.



The Door of Service

Fr. Tom'sThoughts

Dear St. James Parishioners,

Have you ever found a treasure chest? Remember those pirate stories we read when we were kids? Wouldn't it be great to stumble onto a chest

full of treasure? What would we do with it? Think of the houses we could have. Think of the lands we could own. Think of the travels we could take. Think of the friends we could have. Think of the people we could help. It would be really exciting!

I bring this up because we Catholic Christians are truly the richest people in God's plan of salvation. Jesus came so we could have life and have it to the full, here and hereafter. He is **Truth** in Himself; He has shown us the **Way** to His Kingdom; and He's promised us the **Life** for all eternity. We have been adopted by God at our baptism. We know the King of Eternity. He is our brother and He shares with us: His Glory, His Royalty, and even His Divinity.

We have the greatest treasure of all time and we are so blessed! But just having it isn't enough. Like any treasure, we have to open it up, immerse ourselves in it and use it. Otherwise, it's just a pretty box.

I bring this up because we are beginning our yearly **Growing in God's Grace (GIGG)** Commitment Renewal. The graces we've received from God are unfathomable. At the same time, we want to be growing in them. That's why we have our Faith and that's why we want to invest in it – to be adding to our eternal treasure.

The Covid pandemic has had quite an impact on many of us and may have caused us to lose a little momentum in our faith practice. Now would be a great time to commit (or recommit) to going forward. We speak about opening the 4 Doors of GIGG. They are a practical means to grow in our faith – it doesn't just happen – we have to choose to grow.

The first 2 doors of GIGG are **Service** and **Spiritual Growth**. Our **2022 Ministry & Talent Resource Directory** is scheduled to come out later this month. I would encourage everyone to open it up and pray over our response to these 2 doors. We ask - what:

- 1) Ministries or Service Opportunities would we like to participate in?
- 2) Or Adult Faith Groups would we like to join?
- 3) Or Social Activities would we like to be part of?
- 4) Or Community Outreach activities would we like to help?

These doors all help us to grow in faith and lead us to deepen our **Worship** (Door 3) of our generous and wonderful God. And that leads us to wonder – how to respond to all the unfathomable gifts that our loving God has given us? That would be Door 4 of GIGG – **Treasure**.

And that gets us back to where we started – we have been given and hopefully have found the treasure chest of eternal wealth. We have been *sooo blessed!* It's all ours but, at the same time, we don't want to lose it and we should want to make it be even greater. Our GIGG Commitment Weekend will be the weekend of **June 18 & 19**th. We will be exploring all these opportunities in he weeks ahead.



Please join me in praying the beautiful prayer, "Seedtime Blessing". The Midwest faces challenges because of the drought, and across the world from us, Ukraine faces agricultural challenges because of the war...

"Ukraine is on track to harvest most of its vast grain fields this summer — though there are mounting concerns that war-related supply shortages may reduce output by as much as a third. The country also has 30 million tons of wheat in storage. Getting the grain out of the country poses a great challenge. All of Ukraine's Black Sea ports are closed off to the world by a Russian blockade that includes floating mines. And after twenty years of investment in farm-to-port infrastructure, wheat exported by train is just a tiny fraction of what is exported by sea." (Washington Post, April 7, 2022)


Preferential Option for the Poor
