Sr. Lynn Luecke, daughter of Brian and Suzy, recently arrived in Minnesota after spending almost five years in Peru in formation and at her pastoral assignment.

Needing to renew her passport during a pandemic became very difficult, with the US embassy closed and travel restrictions. Couple that with the need for more sisters to help with the many ministries in the Twin Cities, Sr. Lynn was sent to Bloomington where she joins her blood sister, Sr. Leann, and eight other sisters at the Sacred Heart of Jesus convent.

Sr. Lynn arrived at her first pastoral assignment in Arequipa, Peru just two weeks before Peru, and the world went on lock down due to the global pandemic last year. Evangelization must go on despite the virus, so the sisters got creative and began to make short faith-filled videos geared towards the Peruvian children in Spanish. Now that she is back in Minnesota, Sr. Lynn is reclaiming English and joining Sr. Leann, who is usually behind the camera, in this important ministry to evangelize to our little ones and help parents and grandparents in educating children in the faith.


