

In addition, we wish to express our sincere thankfulness to the St. Patrick parishioners for their generosity in support of the parish. According to the IRS guidelines, a contribution is effective when delivered. This means that a check deposited in the church offering basket in January 2022 cannot be deducted in 2021 even if it is backdated in 2021.

One exception - checks that are mailed and postmarked in 2021 are deductible in 2021 even though not received until 2022.
