MEMORIAL MASS FOR FATHER MEL IS JANUARY 13

Father Melvin Hemann, 93, died December 14 in Florida. He donated his body to science. A memorial Mass will be held January 13 at 11 AM at St. Patrick. The Mass will be livestreamed.

Father Hemann, the son of Bernard and Olive (Halbach) Hemann, was born Oct. 15, 1928, in Stacyville. He graduated from Loras College in Dubuque and completed his theological studies at Mount St. Bernard Seminary, also in Dubuque. He was ordained Jan. 31, 1959, by Archbishop Leo Binz at the Cathedral of St. Raphael in Dubuque.



He served as associate pastor of Holy Trinity Parish in Protivin and Holy Cross Parish in Schley, 1959; St. Patrick Parish in Cedar Rapids, 1959-60; St. Peter Parish in New Haven, 1960; St. Benedict Parish in Decorah, 1960-65; and St. Thomas Aquinas Parish and Catholic Student Center in Ames, 1965-72.

He served in team ministry in Mason City, 1972-76, and in Charles City and Roseville, 1976-77. He served as pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Chelsea, 1977-81. He was pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Preston, 1981-91, while also serving as pastor of St. Peter Parish in Sabula and Sacred Heart Parish in Green Island, 1987-91. He was dean of the Bellevue Deanery, 1987-91.

He served as director of the Family Life Office, 1991-98, while also serving as pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Rickardsville, 1991-98, and SS. Peter & Paul Parish in Sherrill and St. Francis Parish in Balltown, 1993-98. He was executive secretary of the Balltown-Sherrill Consolidated School, 1993-98.

He retired in 1998 in Cedar Falls. For nine years, he volunteered as chaplain at American Martyrs Retreat House and, as most retired priests, assisted as needed in area parishes, including St. Patrick.

In 1998, he also fulfilled a lifelong dream when he completed the construction of an RV 6 airplane. At the time, he was national chaplain of Marriage Retorno and the 200-mph plane offered him a means of travel to present weekends throughout the United States.

In his free time, he served as a flight instructor and charter pilot at the Waterloo Airport. He was also active for many years in the National Association of Priest Pilots. In 2019, Father Hemann celebrated sixty years of priesthood. Three years before this, he moved to Palm Coast, Florida, where he assisted at local parishes and with flight instruction at a local airport.

In 2007 I heard Perpetual Adoration in the chapel at Waterloo Columbus was being organized. The few times I had been to Adoration in the past

weren't all that special but decided to attend an informational meeting anyway, probably because years ago my mother and deceased father often went to parishes that offered it.

My faith has always been important to me but I didn't pray regularly except at Mass and to be honest, I wasn't quite sure what I was getting myself into. At the meeting I signed up for the Thursday at 3 AM slot and later invited members of our Knights of Columbus Council to join me. Signing up that night was one of the best deci-



sions I've ever made. I look forward to Adoration almost as much as going to Mass.

At Adoration I get to spend time one-on-one listening and talking with God. He is never too busy. He is never in a bad mood. He never shouts. The chapel is quiet with few distractions. Each visit is special with time for personal meditation, spiritual reading, song, petitions, praise, and thanksgiving.

I regret that I didn't take advantage of going to Adoration until I was almost 50 years old, and I thank God for the people that started it at Columbus. Today at Saint Patrick, Father Ivan has made getting to Eucharistic Adoration even easier. Adoration is available right here in our chapel from 8 to 9 PM Tuesday through Saturday.

Today, I cannot imagine Adoration not being part of my prayer life. And every Christmas when we sing "O Come Let Us Adore Him," I appreciate those words. Christ our King is perpetually waiting for you and me. And the gifts he has waiting for us are immeasurable. Make Adoration in our chapel part of your prayer life and experience for yourself the blessing that it is.


ENJOY WAFFLES, SUPPORT BIRTHRIGHT & ALTERNATIVES



WINTER MINI-RETREAT TO EXPLORE LUKE

The Catholic Parishes of Waterloo will host a mini-retreat on Sunday, January 23, 1:30-4:00 PM, via live video discussion. The Gospel of St. Luke is the source of the Sunday readings during Ordinary Time this year.

In this online discussion, Professor John Waldmeir will discuss the major themes of Luke's gospel. Waldmeir is a professor of Religious Studies and Theology at Loras College, where he also edits the publication series "Spiritual Life in the Upper Mississippi River Valley" for the Archbishop Kucera Center for Catholic Intellectual and Spiritual Life.
